## 2015 Alfalfa Quality Watch

Goal-Relative Feed Value (RFV) of 150

## **Quality Information from 5/26/15**

Most areas received welcome rains over the weekend, now sunshine would be helpful. As you know the first crop alfalfa is ready for harvest. Look for opportunities to harvest without delay for high quality forage.

On average we lose roughly 3-5 RFV points per day, depending on temperatures. The year (2015) we lost, averaged across all PEAQ measurements, 4.5 RFV point per day from May 14th to May 26<sup>th</sup>. PEAQ and Scissor Cut RFVs are about 15 RFV points higher than forage coming out of storage due to respiration and dry matter losses. Alfalfa fields sampled this year were either 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> year production fields.
