Spring General Leader Meeting is this Monday, April 24th starting at 6:30 pm. This will be a great meeting for General Leaders or a representative from the club to attend. In addition to learning about Expanding Access, participants will get a sneak peak into the storage closets at UWEX and learn was lurks in the shadows of fun and crafting.

We have a Sheboygan County **4-H Summer Intern** again this year! Kimberly Mueller will be starting on May 22nd. Several Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics related project leaders met in early November to discuss the "launching" of a concerted effort to meet the needs of local and 4-H youth in the development of STEM related learning. We are excited to be introducing a series of project-based opportunities to explore science and technology related to the **Aerospace Project** this year. All members and non-enrolled youth are welcome for our STEM Programs. Activities will be targeted to youth grades 3-8.

This year Sarah Tarjeson will once again have the opportunity to travel as one of the chaperones on **the 4-H American Spirit Experience**. It is an amazing experience and we recommend that youth grades 8-10th grade apply to be one of the delegates to attend. It involves an 8 day bus trip and participants travel through Amish country out to New York, Boston and Canada!
