In April 2017 the USDA's National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) Civil Rights and Equal Opportunity Program Team conducted a routine civil rights compliance review of Wisconsin's Cooperative Extension, and it focused on two things: Cooperative Extension's employment practice and Wisconsin 4-H. The NIFA team spent several days meeting with staff, reviewing data and observing operations. The reports from NIFA indicated there is some work to do to make sure programming is meeting the highest standards for civil rights compliance required by the USDA.

Wisconsin Extension and the 4-H Youth Development Program as a primary recipient for federal financial assistance both direct and indirect (such as use of the 4-H name and emblem) must assure that any sub-recipient is operating programs in accordance with civil right laws and regulations. Therefore, all of the Sheboygan County 4-H Clubs and Committees must assure non-discrimination in the program, assure minorities are notified about the program, and collect and report race, ethnicity and gender data.

In response to the review, Wisconsin 4-H will develop a State Outreach plan to reach underserved, underrepresented, and socially disadvantaged youth. The plan should especially focus on methods to increase the level of racial and ethnic minorities in organized 4-H clubs and document "all reasonable efforts" to diversity 4-H clubs.

Sarah and Linda recently met with the 4-H Leaders Association Executive Board during their annual retreat, where they led "Building Connections: Reaching Others" to start discussions about how we, as an organization, can serve underserved, underrepresented, and socially disadvantaged youth. The Board came up with the following 2017-2018 SMART goals for the Sheboygan County 4-H Leaders Association:

- 1) Develop a traveling trunk (4-H Display) to be featured at 5 community events throughout the year; the trunk will be available to all clubs and individuals wishing to promote all of the Sheboygan County Clubs.
- 2) Reach out to the Boys and Girls Club of Sheboygan and offer 2-4 project focused events this year.
- 3) Increase youth capacity for engaging as youth project leaders through trainings and personal invitations.

In addition to the efforts of the 4-H Leaders Association, our staff will continue to provide opportunities to youth and youth organizations throughout the city of Sheboygan. Leadership programs and project opportunities apply to all youth, including those of diverse backgrounds and ethnicities.

UW-EXTENSION DROP BOX

USING THE 4-H NAME & EMBLEM

Did you know? The 4-H Name & Emblem is a highly valued mark within our country's history. As such, it was granted a very unique and special status; it is in a category similar to the Presidential Seal and the Olympic Emblem. This federal protection makes it a mark in and of itself with protection that supersedes the limited authorities of both a trademark and a copyright. As a result, responsibility and stewardship for the 4-H Name & Emblem were not given to the US Patent Office but were given to a higher level of the federal government, a member of the Cabinet, the Secretary of Agriculture, at the direct request of Congress. The "18 USC707" is the statement in the United States Code that outlines the protection of the 4-H Name & Emblem.

The official 4-H Emblem is a clover with four leaves and an "H" on each leaf. The clover's stem must point to the right as you look at the image. The 4-H Emblem is not a plain four-leaf clover. The 4-H Emblem should appear in specific colors and in its entirety. The 4-H Name & Emblem belong to the 4-H Youth Development Program, under the authority of USDA and anyone wishing to use it must obtain permission. If you are a 4-H member or volunteer, you are permitted to use the emblem.

In addition to this responsibility, the University of Wisconsin-Extension recently released new guidelines for branding and logo use, including new guidelines for co-branding the UW-Extension logo and the 4-H clover. If you are planning to print club/group t-shirts, posters, etc. please be sure to review the Co-Branding Wisconsin 4-H and UW-Extension Information for Volunteers and utilize the correct co-branded logo found at: http://sheboygan.uwex.edu/files/2010/08/Cobranding-Wisconsin-4H-and-UW-Extension-Information-for-Volunteers.pdf

We are happy to provide it at no cost, as long as it is being used. Literature will also be available for checkout at the Random Lake and Plymouth Public Libraries. If you're not sure if you need literature for a project; why not check it out first!

The creative writing entries are due January 26th and will be judged before the festival due to the time involved in reading and critiquing.

WHAT IS EXPECTED OF 4-H PROJECT LEADERS?

- o First, make sure you're an enrolled 4-H Leader or enrolled as a Youth Leader!
- o Get started now! Member enthusiasm for a project is highest at the time of enrollment. Find out who is enrolled in the project and set up your meetings.
- o Help members keep a record of what they did or made in the project during the year.
- o Review progress toward the year's goals at your final meeting of the year.
- o Organize and conduct at least three to six project meetings per year. Remember project tours and individual sessions can be offered to members in addition to group meetings.
- o Involve youth leaders in meaningful ways. They are capable of helping in planning and teaching--not just being the helper or the clean up crew!
- Set an example in being prepared, organized, and flexible in working with youth.

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY DAIRY PROMOTION SCHOLARSHIPS

It's not too early to begin thinking about scholarships! The Sheboygan County Dairy Promotion Association will be offering up to three \$500 scholarships to Sheboygan County high school seniors enrolling in post-high school education (short course, technical college, 2-year or 4-year college) or for those currently enrolled in their first year of post highschool education. EASTERN WI DHIC SCHOLARSHIPS

WISCONSIN STATE FAIR DAIRY PROMOTION BOARD

The Wisconsin State Fair Dairy Promotion Board is offering \$1,000 scholarships to be used during the second semester of the 2018-19 school year.

Third and fourth-year college students pursuing dairy-related or food science degrees at one of Wisconsin's four-year universities are eligible to apply. Additional scholarships will be available to high school seniors planning to pursue a dairy-related or food science degree at one of Wisconsin's four-year universities or students studying in a two-year, technical school program related to dairy or food science.

Applicants will be evaluated on involvement and leadership in dairy-related activities, scholastic achievement, and career objectives. Finalists will be interviewed in mid-April, with the recipients to be recognized at the 2018 Wisconsin State Fair.

WISCONSIN PORK ASSOCIATION OFFERS SCHOLARSHIPS

The Wisconsin Pork Association is offering scholarships to high school seniors and college students. Students with a sincere interest in the swine industry are encouraged to apply. The applications for all below can be found at www.wppa.org.

Wisconsin Pork Association Scholarship

The Wisconsin Pork Association Scholarship is awarded to high school seniors pursuing post-high school education. Preference is given to individuals who have been involved in, and posses a sincere interest in, the pork industry. The scholarship application deadline is Dec 1, 2017.

Eligibility Requirements

- 1. Applicants must possess a sincere interest in the pork industry
- 2. All applicants must pursue post-high school education (college, vocational school, or short course).
- 3. Only seniors enrolled in a Wisconsin high school are eligible to apply.

Whitmore Memorial Scholarship

Wisconsin Pork Association, in cooperation with Marian Whitmore, established a Whitmore Memorial Fund in August of 1991. The late Rex Whitmore was a master statesman and communicator throughout the swine industry. He served as Poland China fieldman, test station manager, swine judge, and first executive director of the Wisconsin Pork Producers Association. Rex was always willing to help a young person with a swine project. Rex was a real leader. His enthusiasm and positive attitude were strengths he was well know for. Rex will be missed, but his memory will live on through this scholarship. The application deadline for this scholarship is Dec 1, 2017.

Eligibility Requirements

- 1. Must be a registered junior or senior in college at one of the following University of Wisconsin campuses: Madison, Platteville, River Falls
- 2. Preference given to a Wisconsin resident
- 3. Priority given to those applicants pursuing an Animal Science major or closely related major.
- 4. Criteria considerations include, but not limited to:
 - o Grade point applicant should be in top one-third of class
