Frequently Asked Questions:

Am I required to attend project meetings to exhibit my beef project at the Sheboygan County Fair? No, there are no meeting requirements to exhibit your market or breeding livestock project at the Sheboygan County Fair. However, to be eligible to sell a market animal project in the Meat Animal Sale, an exhibitor is required to acquire a minimum of 8 points for meeting attendance.

Can I show more than one livestock species (beef, sheep, or swine)? An exhibitor is only allowed to exhibit one market livestock species. However, an individual can show in more than one livestock species if both species are breeding stock (beef and sheep only) or if one species is shown as a market animal and the second species is shown as breeding stock.

I am planning only to show a heifer (breeding stock) or a feeder calf this year. Am I required to have my animal identified at the initial weigh-in? No. The initial weigh-in and identification is only required for market animals which an exhibitor hopes to sell in the Meat Animal Sale.

I plan on showing a market animal at the Sheboygan County Fair, but do not want to qualify for the sale. Am I required to identify my animal at the initial weigh-in? No, you are not required to identify your market animal at the initial weigh-in to show your market animal. However, it is encouraged. Once the initial weigh-in is passed and you decide later in the summer to qualify for the sale, it will be too late.

Is meat quality assurance a requirement at the Sheboygan County Fair? Quality assurance is required for swine exhibitors only in order to show at the Sheboygan County Fair. Beef and sheep exhibitors do not have to be certified in quality assurance to show at the fair, but must be certified to be eligible to sell in the Meat Animal Sale.
