National Volunteer Week is April 7-13, 2019

As you learned during Volunteer Orientation, there are different types of 4-H volunteers. This letter will better describe the most common 4-H volunteer leadership roles. No matter which volunteer role you choose, you will see how your service will benefit your family, local youth, your own skill development, and your connections in the community.

Organizational Volunteer Leaders – Organizational leaders provide overall leadership for a 4-H club. As the title indicates, this person is an organizer, not someone who does everything for the club. A club can have more than one organizational leader, if needed, and tips on how to divide up responsibilities are in the Team Leadership Role Description (http://4h.uwex.edu/clubs/starting.cfm).

Project Volunteer Leaders – Project volunteer leaders work with a small group of 4-H members to help them reach their learning goals in a specific project. Members set their own project goals and need the support and encouragement from project volunteer leaders. Project volunteer leaders should establish a regular schedule of project experiences where members can gather to work on their projects. The activities that occur at project meetings should vary.

Youth Volunteer Leaders – Young people who have been 4-H members for several years might be ready to expand their leadership role within their 4-H club. These members may have shown leadership qualities through their project work or by serving on a committee. Youth leaders will need support and encouragement from the adult volunteers and their parents in order to be successful.

Activity Volunteer Leaders – Activity volunteers help members carry out specific activities the club has included in its program for the year. These may be field trips, community service projects, fundraisers, or social events. To begin the planning process, an activity volunteer leader should help members form a committee and agree on the goals of the activity. Tasks that youth may need help with include planning, gathering information, obtaining resources, assigning responsibilities, promoting the activity, overseeing people and tasks, managing risk, and evaluating.

ACTION STEPS

- Check out the additional resources for volunteer leaders at 4-H Community Club Central. Resources and assistance are available for all volunteer roles.
- Ask the 4-H Youth Development Educator for an enrollment list broken down by projects in the club.
- Identify popular projects and ask project leaders and youth what they plan to learn and teach this year. This is available directly to volunteers through <u>4-H Online</u>.
- Write volunteer role descriptions for each of the roles your club needs to fill. Describe the tasks involved and how filling the role will benefit youth and the volunteer. Pass it around at a meeting.
- When asking for help, be specific. "Can you help the youth plan a trip to the nature center on June 5th?" will be easier to say yes to than "Can you help provide leadership for our 4-H club this year?"

Supper Bread

3 ½ cups all purpose flour 3 Tbs sugar

1 Tbs baking powder

1 ½ tsp salt 12 oz beer 1 egg (beaten)

Adjust oven rack to lower-middle position and heat oven to 375 degrees. Mix flour, sugar, baking powder and salt in large bowl. *Add beer and stir with a fork until just combined. Turn dough onto a floured surface;knead quickly to form a ball. Place bread on a baking sheet and confidently slit an X on top with a serrated or very sharp knife. Brush loaf with egg wash. Bake until golden brown, about 45 minutes. Transfer to a wire rack to cool. Serve.

If a member gets injured at a leader's project meeting or at any 4-H sponsored activity, the member's family insurance becomes the primary coverage after our American Income Accident Insurance Policy. The insurance provided by Sheboygan County is intended to protect members and volunteer leaders from damages.

As a 4-H leader, it is important to reduce your liability risk as much as possible. Be sure to provide safety instruction in all risk situations - and take all necessary precautions to assure safe activities. If you are planning any activities that could be considered "out of the ordinary" and might increase risk, contact Sarah so we can verify liability insurance coverage for the activity.

2019 BLUE RIBBON SALE OF CHAMPIONS FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

The Blue Ribbon Sale of Champions Foundation will offer \$30,500 in scholarship awards this year. There will be five \$2000 scholarships, six \$1,500 awards, seven \$1000 scholarships, and eight \$500 scholarships and one special, Rudy VanFleet Memorial Scholarship - \$500. These scholarships recognize the achievements of Wisconsin State Fair Junior Livestock exhibitors and assist them with their educational expenses.

Eligibility Requirements:

1. Individuals must be between the ages of 17-19 as of January 1st of the current year.

2. Individuals must be a current or past junior livestock exhibitor who has exhibited beef, sheep, and/or swine at the Wisconsin State Fair.

3. Individuals must pursue a post high school education, and be enrolled or planning to enroll in a University, Vocational/Technical School or University short course.

4. Only one scholarship will be awarded per individual.

Scholarship Procedure:

1. We request that all applicants complete and return a Blue Ribbon Sale of Champions Foundation Scholarship Application on-line to be submitted no later than Monday, April 15, 2019. **If you submitted an application in 2018 you can use the same log-in information.** If you are not able to apply on-line, you may print the scholarship application, available on our website <u>www.gbrla.com</u>, and submit by regular mail, postmarked no later than Monday, April 15, 2019 and mail to the address listed on the bottom of the application.

2. Twenty seven recipients will be chosen from the applications received by the scholarship committee. The top eleven finalists will interview for the top awards. These are one-time scholarships.

3. Applications will be judged on the following basis: State Fair participation, 35%; Leadership activities, 30%; Interview, 20%; Scholastic Achievement, 10%; Career plans, 5%.

4. Each of the 11 finalists will be interviewed on Tuesday, August 6, 2019 to determine the scholarship winners.

5. The top candidates will receive the scholarships regardless of species exhibited.

6. Winners will be recognized at the Governor's Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction on Wednesday, August 7, 2019.

7. The scholarship will be awarded after receiving a copy of the class schedule for the fall semester.

WISCONSIN STATE FAIR 2019 840 EARTAG AND DNA IDENTIFICATION PROGRAM UPDATES

Wisconsin State Fair and various county fairs throughout Wisconsin have been utilizing 840 eartag and DNA technology to identify potential Fair animals in the Beef, Sheep, and Swine project for the last 15 years. The requirements of these Identification technologies have proven to be instrumental in safeguarding the reputation and integrity of our States Youth livestock programs. For the past few years the Wisconsin Livestock Identification Consortium (WLIC) has handled the entire Wisconsin State Fair 840 eartag and DNA Identification program. With WLIC's switch to utilize DNA tissue sampling and the higher costs associated with it, Wisconsin State Fair will provide an additional option for 840 eartag and DNA hair identification.

840 Eartag and DNA Identification Submission Due Date: Beginning in 2019, all Wisconsin State Fair DNA identification requirements for Junior Show Beef, Sheep, and Swine (market and non-registered breeding stock) must be submitted postmarked May 17th or before to:

DNA Hair Samples: return to Wisconsin State Fair, Agriculture Department, 640 S 84th St, West Allis WI 53214 Tissue (TSU) Samples: return to Wisconsin Livestock Identification Consortium, 135 Enterprise Dr, Suite ID, Verona WI 53593

840 Eartag Identification: Wisconsin State Fair requires an official 840 eartag for identification. The 840 eartag Identification does not have to have RFID technology and may come from any source. The last 4 digits of the 15-digit number sequence will be the numbers to record for individual animal identification. 840 eartags do NOT need to be purchased through Wisconsin State Fair; however, Wisconsin State Fair will offer individual 840 eartags for sale.

DNA Hair Identification: Wisconsin State Fair's preferred method of DNA submission is hair samples. DNA hair kits will be offered for sale by Wisconsin State Fair (<u>https://wismis.fairmanager.com/</u>) online with payment by credit card.

Cost: DNA hair kit and 840 tag: \$11 DNA hair kit (envelope only): \$6 840 eartag (only - no envelope): \$5

Online sales will cease on Sunday, May 12th at 5 pm (Central Time) and only walk up orders (paid with a credit card) will be accepted from May 13th – 17th. Our office hours for walk up orders are Monday – Friday: 8 am to 4:30 pm in the Administrative Offices located in the basement of the Tommy G. Thompson Youth Center (640 S 84th St, West Allis WI 53214).

ALL DNA HAIR samples must be returned to Wisconsin State Fair (Wisconsin State Fair, Agriculture Department, 640 S 84th St, West Allis WI 53214) postmarked May 17th or before. Please plan accordingly.

WLIC DNA Program: Wisconsin State Fair will accept WLIC County Fair identification programs (eartag and DNA) for meeting Wisconsin State Fair identification requirements. WLIC will provide Wisconsin State Fair identification information for those participating in their program who wish to be eligible for Wisconsin State Fair.

Purchasing and submission of 840 eartags and/or DNA kits is NOT your entry in the 2019 Wisconsin State Fair Junior Show. Exhibitors MUST enter the Junior Show online on wistatefair.com in the beginning of April in a separate database.

April kicks off the training season for the Dog Project. Read on for more details of the happenings this month. Join our Facebook page (Sheboygan County 4-H Dog Project) and watch your emails for updates and announcements.

The second MANDATORY MEETING will be Thursday, April 11 in the Wombat Room, room 2114. Your closest parking option for the meeting is near the Acuity Technology Center Entrance,



which is the main entrance on campus. Go in the main door by the library, up the steps and follow the signs to your left to get to the Wombat Room. If you did not attend the March meeting, you must come to this session in order to train. It will start at 6:30 PM. At least one parent or guardian is expected to attend along with the 4-H member. We will be reviewing the handbook, training schedule, and answering any questions you have about the project. Please bring all fees and forms to the meeting as we will be reviewing them and helping kids get registered. By April 11, you will be in the window of time to get the fecal test done. If you can do this and complete the Health Form, please bring it and a copy of the Rabies Certificate to this orientation meeting. Fecal tests can be done after March 28. If you attended the first orientation meeting, be sure to bring your completed Health Form and copy of the Rabies Certificate to the first night of training. Please attach the copy of the rabies certificate to the health form along with a side view photo of your dog. Members will not be allowed to train or get credit for training until the forms are complete, including rabies certificate and photo. Training starts this month! Obedience, Rally and Showmanship will start on April 25. Meet near the Coliseum for announcements and to turn in paperwork. Dogs should remain in your vehicle until the Health Form is approved and announcements are made. Announcements will be made at 6:10 PM.

Agility training begins on April 30. Meet behind the horse barn at the Plymouth Fairgrounds. First years start at 6 PM, all others start at 7 PM. First years should arrive by 5:45 to help set up the course, and the later class should plan to put the equipment away at the end of the evening. If you don't attend Thursday night training, remember to bring any paperwork on April 30.

At training sessions, be aware of the other dogs and people around you. Everyone, including dogs, will be excited that evening and your dog may not react like you expect. If you cannot hold your dog, give the leash to someone who is not holding one. No one should be controlling more than one dog at a time. Bring water for your dog and dress appropriately for the weather. We train in the rain, so be prepared. We will have a limited supply of equipment available for purchase at training nights.
