Camp Staff Training is happening in full swing. We had our Kick Off meeting on Friday, March 29th and had a great start to the unique youth-adult partnership that happens with camp staff! Our next training when we are all together will be June 9th, meanwhile staff are completing some online learning modules and getting committee's together to make plans.

Spring General Leader Meeting is Monday on April, 29th starting at 7:00 pm. This will be a great meeting for General Leaders or a representative from the club to attend.
