Pesticide Applicator Certification/ Recertification

Is your Pesticide Certification card still good or has it expired? Or, do you need to be certified to use restricted use pesticides? Over the years, many new products have been classified as restricted use. This requires the user to be certified to purchase and use the product. There are two ways to become certified or recertified.

The University of Wisconsin provides the educational program. The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection issue the certificate and the certificate is good for five years.

Pesticide Applicator Certification/Recertification

Do you plan on using a Restricted Use Pesticide (RUP) AND produce an agricultural commodity on your property or your employers property? Do I need to Certified? You must be certified if you apply or direct the use of:

*restricted-use pesticides

*pesticides on a for-hire basis

*pesticides in aquatic environments You need to be certified if you pesticide-safety training to agricultural workers or pesticide handlers as required under the Worker Protection Standard (WPS).

You quality as a private applicator is you meet both of the following criteria:

You use or direct the use of pesticides for the purpose of producing an agricultural commodity. The applications occur on land owned or rented by you or your employer, or on someone else's land if for exchange of goods or services between agricultural producers.

Private applicator may make incidental applications on someone else's land for monetary compensation provided the application are for the production of an agricultural commodity. Unlike applications made for exchange of good or service, however, application made for commodity are limited to a total of 500 acres spanning application for no more than 3 different agricultural producers in any calendar year'; if you exceed either limit, you are considered commercial applicator for hire.
