

 Repurposed Egg Carton Flower Wreath: Use a cardboard egg carton and paint to transform recyclining into a beautiful floral wreath! Learn a few simple tricks to make this otherwise useless item into a wall decoration!



- - 2. **Basic Silk Flower Arranging:** Learn the basics of making a floral centerpiece. There will be a step by step instruction on how to create your own masterpiece to take home. There will also be instruction on simple bow making.
- 3. **Paper Crafts:** Make popular paper Cati, shaker cards and other various paper crafts. This class is taught in honor of Roberta Rotsted.



- 5. **Exploding Scrapbook:** Put together a mini exploding scrapbook.
- 6. **Folded Paper Wreath:** Make a paper wreath using several pieces of colorful scrapbook paper. Each piece of paper is folded using origami techniques and then the pieces are assembled into a wreath shape and glued into place.
- 7. **Take Note:** Make two note collectors. Both a framed, wipe-off board to leave messages for others, and a note pad to decorate and be useful either on a table or hung up. While at the class you will be able to choose your own colors to completely personalize your project.



- 8. **Beginner Ballet:** Learn basic exercises and steps. Perform simple combinations at slow tempos along with some movement principles and putting it all to music!
- 9. **Acrylic Painting:** Create a masterpiece on canvas with easy step-by-step instruction. No matter what level of artistic skill you have, you are sure to take home something beautiful!
- 10. **Painted Rocks:** Painting rocks to hide around town, promote 4-H, use as gifts or simply express your artistic side using nature & color.

11. **Tin Foil Art:** Create a unique 8 1/2 x 11 art piece using aluminum foil, black shoe polish and your imagination. Assortment of designs to choose from including floral, pet, wildlife, patriotic, etc.



- 12. **Photography for Beginners:** Learn how to take great images of objects. Learn where to focus in the image and portrait photography. Feel free to bring your camera along!
- 13. All About Soap Making: Learn how chemical reactions make simple ingredients into soap. Decorate your own soap with mica paint and learn about soap clay.



- 14. Cake Decorating Fun-damentals: Learn the basic decorating techniques to design beautiful cakes. We will use various icing tips, such as shell, drop flowers, leaves and basket weave. Bring a cake, cake dummy, or cupcakes to decorate if you like. These should be coated with a base icing.
- 15. **Unique Perspectives:** A Mixed Media Collage Adventure: With a variety of magazines and old books, the participants will search for images that interest them, then arrange them in a way that shows a unique perspective about



themselves. Through the use of markers, paint sticks and other mediums to add additional colors, details or words to the image.



- 16. Copper Jewelry (grades 3 and up): Using a copper 'blank' bracelet and a few simple tools, learn how to hammer a design to make a custom piece of art. Be sure to register in Arts/Celebrate Arts to show this creation off at the fair!
- 17. **Leather Crafts:** Learn about leather crafting and make your own buckskin leather pouch.
