#### HCE Book Club News- Nancy Wagner & JoAnn Gadicke

In our next book titled *The Good Neighbor* Maxwell King reveals Fred Rogers (1928–2003), creator of Mister Rogers' Neighborhood, whose guiding principles of his Christian faith—kindness, acceptance, and unconditional love—underpinned every aspect of his professional and personal life. Arranged more or less chronologically, the story traces Rogers's development from an often sickly and overweight child, subjected to childhood bullying and an overprotective mother. His upbringing, while often socially isolating, provided a rich environment for the development of his creativity; he went on to study musical composition and become ordained as a Presbyterian minister. Neighborhood, which ran from 1968 to 2001, was radical for its time, covering war, death, divorce, and other controversial topics honestly and respectfully for children's understanding. *Grown*-up fans, pop culture enthusiasts, and anyone interested in the history of educational television and child development will be inspired.

If you do not receive verification within three weeks, please call or email the WAHCE Cultural Arts Chair.

IMPORTANT: **All entrants MUST sign the Registration form.** Please read and sign below; entries will NOT be accepted if unsigned. Entrants will not hold WAHCE responsible for any loss or damage to any item submitted for use in the WAHCE Cultural Arts Show. Entrants give permission for their photo, photos of their entry, and/or print copies of their written entry to be used by WAHCE as seen fit.

All work must be done by entrant and completed after last year's county show. It must receive a first place at this year's county show or fair. All items must be clean or laundered or will be disqualified by the judge. Kits and patterns may be used as long as entrant does all the work. # Rich Sweet Dough Professional Baking 3<sup>rd</sup> Edition Le Cordon Bleu - Wayne Gisslen

Mix with paddle to create a sponge:

8 oz. milk (scalded and cooled)

1 oz. fresh yeast (or  $1\frac{1}{2}$  pkg. dry yeast)

10 oz. bread flour

Let rise until double in bulk.

Cream: 8 oz. butter

4 oz. sugar

.25 oz. salt

Add: 5 oz. eggs

Add: the yeast sponge

Change to dough hook.

Add: 10 oz. bread flour

Mix until it forms a nice soft dough.

Knead in mixer about 3 min.

Put dough in bowl or pan. Cover and refrigerate till dough is firm.

Shape dough and let rise until double. Bake accordingly to what you are making.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION DISCLOSURE (BID) INSTRUCTIONS

The Background Information Disclosure form (F-82064) gathers Information as required by the Wisconsin Caregiver Background Check Law to help employers and governmental regulatory agencies make employment, contract, residency, and regulatory decisions. Complete and return the entire form and attach explanations as specified by employer or governmental regulatory agency. NOTE: If you are an owner, operator, board member, or non client resident of a Division of Quality Assurance (DQA) facility, complete the BID. F-82064, and the Appendix. F-82069, and submit both forms to the address noted in the Appendix Instructions.

#### CAREGIVER BACKGROUND CHECK LAW

In accordance with the provisions of Chapters 48.685 and 50.065, Wis. Stats., for persons who have been convicted of certain acts, crimes, or offenses:

- 1. The Department of Health Services (DHS) may not license, certify, or register the person or entity (Note: Employers and Care Providers are referred to as "entities");
- A county agency may not certify a child care or license a foster or treatment foster home;
- A child placing agency may not license a foster or treatment foster home or contract with an adoptive parent applicant for a child adoption;
- A school board may not contract with a licensed child care provider; and
- 5. An entity may not employ, contract with or, permit persons to reside at the entity.

The list of offenses affecting caregiver eligibility that require rehabilitation review is available from the regulatory agencies or through the Internet at http://DHS.wisconsin.gov/caregiver/StatutesINDEX.HTM.

#### THE CAREGIVER LAW COVERS THE FOLLOWING EMPLOYERS / CARE PROVIDERS (Referred to as "Entitles"):

#### THE CAREGIVER LAW COVERS THE FOLLOWING PERSONS:

- Anyone employed by or contracting with a covered entity who has access to the clients served, except if the access is infrequent or sporadic and service is not directly related to care of the client.
- Anyone who is a Child Care Provider who contracts with a School Board under Wisconsin Statute 120.13 (14).
- Anyone who lives on the premises of a covered entity and is 10 years old or over, but is not a client ("nonclient resident").
- Anyone who is licensed by DHS
- Anyone who has a foster home licensed by DHS.
- Anyone certified by DHS.
- Anyone who is a Child Care Provider certified by a county department.
- Anyone registered by DHS.
- Anyone who is a board member or corporate officer who has access to the clients served.

#### FAIR EMPLOYMENT ACT

Wisconsin's Fair Employment Law, Chapters 111.31 - 111.395, Wis. Stats., prohibits discrimination because of a criminal record or pending charge; however, it is not discrimination to decline to hire or license a person based on the person's arrest or conviction record if the arrest or conviction is substantially related to the circumstances of the particular job or licensed activity.

#### PERSONALLY IDENTIFIABLE INFORMATION

This information is used to obtain relevant data as required by the provisions set forth by the Wisconsin Caregiver Background Check Law. Providing your social security number is voluntary; however, your social security number is one of the unique identifiers used to prevent incorrect matches. For example, the Department of Justice uses social security numbers, names, gender, race, and date of birth to prevent incorrect matches of persons with criminal convictions. The Department of Health Services' Caregiver Misconduct Registry uses social security numbers as one identifier to prevent incorrect matches of persons with findings of abuse or neglect of a client or misappropriation of a client's property.
