4-H SPIN Membership: Time for another look?

Perhaps the Special Interest 4-H Membership (SPIN) wasn't something you paid attention to previously; maybe it's time to take another look. Many clubs are struggling to find the next best thing to do with their members. If you find yourself in the position of having to choose to drop out of 4-H or continue in the activities that you are most interested in and have a passion for – perhaps 4-H SPIN Membership is the right choice for you! Read on . . .



SPIN Membership allows youth to belong to 4-H, build friendships, master new skills, practice independence, and give back to their community through one of its county-wide projects. As a SPIN Member, a young person will enroll and select one, or more, of the county-wide projects to participate in. SPIN members will meet their needs for belonging and leadership through the county-wide project experiences rather than with a year-long club. The option of SPIN membership requires a less intensive commitment of time and still allows members the benefits of 4-H.

"New families are often overwhelmed by the 4-H Program," says Nancy Brown, 4-H General Leader of the Madison All Stars 4-H Club. "This option allows them to get started at a more manageable pace and then, perhaps later, expand on their experience." According to 4-H staff in Sheboygan County, the new option is designed to prevent the loss of members who want to participate but also want to be active with school clubs, sports, other youth programming or even part time jobs.

In addition to participating and completing all of the required countywide project experiences, 4-H SPIN Members must also:

- Complete a 4-H Project Record
- Participate in a show, competition, demonstration or other event showcasing the content or skills learned throughout participation in the project. This may or may not be the Sheboygan County Fair
- 4-H SPIN Membership costs \$20 per member or \$50 per family payable to the Sheboygan County 4-H Leaders Association
- Agree to and follow all expectations and policies of the Sheboygan County 4-H Program

Special Interest (SPIN) Membership is only available for the following projects/groups in Sheboygan County:

- Sheboygan County 4-H Cat Project
- Sheboygan County 4-H Dog Project
- Sheboygan County 4-H Dairy Project
- Sheboygan County 4-H Goat Project
- Sheboygan County 4-H Horse and Pony Project
- Sheboygan County 4-H Livestock Project
- Sheboygan County 4-H Rabbit and Cavy Project
- Sheboygan County 4-H Shooting Sports
- Sheboygan County 4-H Youth Association/Youth Leadership (grades 7 and up only)
- Sheboygan County 4-H Cloverbud Program (grades K-2 only)
- Sheboygan County 4-H Concert Band
- Sheboygan County 4-H Poultry Project

"There are definitely pros and cons for both of these membership options," says Sarah Tarjeson, 4-H Youth Development Educator, "but both options provide young people an opportunity for belonging, mastery, independence and generosity. Families need options and Sheboygan County 4-H will deliver!" 2 New Charter Videos Available for Volunteers

Two new charter videos are available thanks to the focused effort of Eileen Van Dyk, 4-H Program Educator in Polk and St. Croix Counties, who created the videos to help Wisconsin 4-H Leaders complete their charters.

- <u>Completing Wisconsin 4-H Charters, 2020-2021</u> Viewers will learn how to complete the first four pages of the Wisconsin 4-H Charter during the 2020-2021 organizational year, including how to fill in each section of the form, what additional documentation is needed, how to set and plan for club/group SMART goals, and plan the club/group calendar of activities.
- <u>Completing Wisconsin 4 H Financial Records</u>, <u>2020-2021</u> Viewers will learn how to complete the financial records portion of the Wisconsin 4-H Charter during the 2020-2021 organizational year, including information about each section of the financial pages, how to fill out and check the annual accounting form, and what's required on

the second financial page.

In the description, volunteers are encouraged that if they have further questions about the charter or financial pages, they should contact the local 4-H Program or Positive Youth Development Educator in their county.
