Checklist/Approval form. Please be sure you are using this latest version of the PPC dated November 17, 2020. Also be sure to refer to the resources that can be found in our Sheboygan County shared google drive related to Extension Program Planning Checklists! As always, when county policies are stricter than those of UW-Madison, Division of Extension we will follow our local recommendations. For your reference, the Emergency Alert from Sheboygan

County includes the following:

Given the current status of COVID19 and the effects it is having on our public health and health care systems, Sheboygan County Division of Public Health implores all communities within Sheboygan County to take the following actions:

Follow the WI State Emergency Order #1 and Order #3; FAQ can be found here. Businesses and community organizations should follow WEDC Guidelines . When possible encourage remote work opportunities to support physical distancing. Retail, Hospitality, Restaurants/Bars: To the extent possible, limit person to person contact and

encourage curbside pick-up/delivery options. Require masking/face coverings. Community and Large Gatherings: Do not hold indoor gatherings.

Limit outdoor gatherings to 10 people or fewer; physically distance and wear face coverings. Concerts, Festivals, Sporting Events: Do not hold these events at this time.






Our second annual "Holiday in the Woods" will be held on







