Meetings and Programs Here's the very least you should know: All in-person program must have a Program Approval Checklist submitted!

All in-person programs are limited to small groups of about 10 people or fewer. Multiple small groups may meet in an outdoor location if the groups can maintain distance of 20 ft or Individuals cannot rotate between small groups – but a leader or facilitator could if they maintain 10

feet distance and wear a mask. Most indoor events will be limited to 10 people maximum. An event with more people might be considered is the facility has separate rooms for each group of 10 or fewer. Plans have to detail how the group plans to avoid congregated spaces (like restrooms and
