- IF your coach, his/her parents, and your parents feel that you are ready to handle a horse at a show, there are several classes available at some of the area 4-H horse shows that you can enter.
- You are being given a great opportunity to learn about horses. It is VERY important that you are respectful to your coach, their horse, your parents, and your 4-H leaders.

We cannot guarantee that we will be able to match you to a coach for the current 4-H year. In the event we aren't able to pair you with a coach, we will do our best to create opportunities for you to get some experience handling a horse.
