Tools & Accessories:

Scissors or rotary cutter & mat ruler

Project Tips:

Cut both layers of fleece at same time. Trim off selvage edges. Both pieces should now be the same size.

Herramientas & Accesorios:

Tijeras o un cortador de rodecilla y una regla para tapicería.

Consejos para el proyecto:

Corte ambas capas del muletón a la vez. Recorte los bordes de la (orilla). Ahora ambas piezas son del mismo tamaño.

Instructions:


- 1. Place fleece layers wrong sides together. Cut 5" squares out of both pieces of fleece at each corner.
- 2. To make fringe, cut 5" into fleece at 1" intervals around all four sides of both layers.
- 3. Knot fringe pieces together, using one strand from the top layer and one strand from the bottom. Repeat around all four edges.

Instrucciones:

- 1. Junte las capas de muletón revés contra revés. Corte cuadrados de 5" en cada esquina de ambas piezas del muletón.
- 2. Para hacer flequillos, corte ambas capas de muletón de 5" con intervalos de 1" por todos los cuatro lados.
- 3. Amarre cada fleco de la capa de arriba con cada fleco de la capa de abajo. Proceda de la misma manera para todos los cuatro lados de la manta.

HCE Book Club News- Nancy Wagner & JoAnn Gadicke



Looking back on our next book originally slated for discussion in April 2020 it seems like so long ago that we decided on this book to read. Titled "The Good Neighbor," Maxwell King reveals Fred Rogers (1928-2003), creator of Mister Rogers' Neighborhood, whose guiding principles of his Christian faith—kindness, acceptance, and unconditional love—underpinned every aspect of his professional and personal life. Arranged more or less chronologically, the story traces Rogers's development from an often sickly and overweight child, subjected to childhood bullying and an overprotective mother. His upbringing, while often socially isolating, provided a rich environment for the development of his creativity; he went on to study musical composition and become ordained as a Presbyterian minister. Neighborhood, which ran from 1968 to 2001, was radical for its time, covering war, death, divorce, and other controversial topics honestly and respectfully for children's understanding. Grown-up fans, pop culture enthusiasts, and anyone interested in the history of educational television and child development will be inspired.

We will tentatively attempt once again to meet in person and discuss the book The Good Neighbor, on Wednesday, March 31st, 2021, 11:30 am, Roadside Bar & Grill, Highway 57, Plymouth.

Nancy has ordered our next book, titled "Finding Chika; a little girl, an earthquake, and the making of a family" by Mitch Albom. She will bring the books to the meeting. Think positive and hope for our March meeting to take place.

The enthusiasm for learning in Nicaragua is immense and you are helping to open opportunities for many. I just ordered some cards, both \$25 and \$50 denomination. Another email from Amy was about shipping supplies. On January 14, they were happy to report 3 containers loaded the week of November 16 had safely arrived to the W/NP warehouse in Managua and are being distributed.

The Stevens Point office is very thankful for funds, items, doing all the work involved in packing. There were school desks, and Fire department turn out gear and other items useful for their stations. Also, at the end of the unloading process four police officers came to make sure they were all safe in the neighborhood and that no incident occurred during the unloading process. Amy wrote again thanks for making possible another successful shipment from Wisconsin to Nicaragua.

Only one entry on each registration form. Send all forms together immediately after county show including written entries. A County may enter a total of 12 entries plus one Bonus Category 20. A county cannot have duplicate entries in any lettered sub-category. The County Cultural Arts Chair must include a self-addressed postcard or email address to verify receipt of registration forms. If you do not receive verification within three weeks, please call or email the WAHCE Cultural Arts Chair.

IMPORTANT: **All entrants MUST sign the Registration form.** Please read and sign below; entries will NOT be accepted if unsigned. Entrants will not hold WAHCE responsible for any loss or damage to any item submitted for use in the WAHCE Cultural Arts Show. Entrants give permission for their photo, photos of their entry, and/or print copies of their written entry to be used by WAHCE as seen fit.

All work must be done by entrant and completed after last year's county show. It must receive a first place at this year's county show or fair.
