Jerry H. Cherney was born and raised on a dairy farm in central Wisconsin, receiving a B.S. degree in Plant Pathology from the University of Wisconsin. After a three-year tour as a North Vietnamese linguist for the U.S. Army Security Agency, he received a M.S. degree in agronomy from the University of Wisconsin and a Ph.D. in agronomy from the University of Minnesota. He became the New York State forage specialist in 1990, focusing on perennial grass management and quality. His primary research program is in forage quality, management, and utilization to identify ways to profitably manage forage crops, while focusing on the profitability of New York State's forage/livestock

operations. Conducting forage research in the context of environmental concerns has always been a priority for Dr. Cherney.
