4-H Membership Drive Update!!!!



Learning to Breathe Series

Feeling stressed and overwhelmed?! Juggling too much with school, community, and family pressures? We have just the thing for you...our first Virtual Learning Community Learning to BREATHE Series. Learning to BREATHE is a mindfulness curriculum providing tools and resources for young leaders to focus on their present-moment experiences. This Virtual Learning Community series for youth 9-12 grades will help participants focus on the present with compassion and openness. The six-week series, Mondays from March 15-April 19, will focus on attention and emotion regulation, cultivate wholesome emotions like gratitude and compassion, expand stress management skills, and help integrate mindfulness into daily life.

Kitchen Science Savvy: What Makes Better Bubbles Virtual Session

What does a "better bubble" mean to you? Can you design a fair experiment to determine how milkfat affects milk bubblicity? This will be part one of a two-part (virtual) Kitchen Science Savvy series run by BioTrek. The session will be 30 minutes and 4-H members can easily find the necessary materials in their kitchens. Session is March 16,

Kitchen Science Savvy: Milk Fireworks Virtual Session

When we look at milk, we see an opaque, white liquid. We can't see that milk is actually a colloid made up of many solids suspended in a liquid. What are the solids in milk and how do we test they are there? Join us and come be a 'Scientest' as we use our Kitchen Science Savvy to experiment with milk fireworks and explore some of milk's inner workings. Session is March 23.
