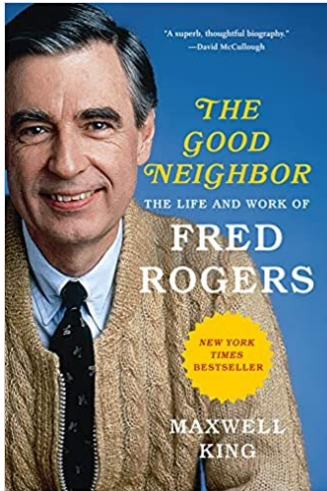

HCE Book Club News- Nancy Wagner & JoAnn Gadick



Looking back on our next book originally slated for discussion in April 2020 it seems like so long ago that we decided on this book to read. Titled "The Good Neighbor," Maxwell King reveals Fred Rogers (1928-2003), creator of Mister Rogers' Neighborhood, whose guiding principles of his Christian faith—kindness, acceptance, and unconditional love—underpinned every aspect of his professional and personal life. Arranged more or less chronologically, the story traces Rogers's development from an often sickly and overweight child, subjected to childhood bullying and an overprotective mother. His upbringing, while often socially isolating, provided a rich environment for the development of his creativity; he went on to study musical composition and become ordained as a Presbyterian minister. Neighborhood, which ran from 1968 to 2001, was radical for its time, covering war, death, divorce, and other controversial topics honestly and respectfully for children's understanding. Grown-up fans, pop culture enthusiasts, and anyone interested in the history of educational television and child development will be inspired.

County International Project

I was on a zoom annual meeting with Wis/Nicaragua partners. It was interesting because 3 people from Nicaragua also were on the zoom. The meeting is generally held in Stevens Point.

The first item mentioned was that W/NP is receiving 500 Sealy mattresses. 12 inches are cut off each mattress for sale display, so the company donated all these mattresses. Some have been shipped to Nicaragua and the ladies have devised a cover for the mattress. More will be shipped in in the next shipment. 3 containers loaded the week of November 16 had arrived in January to the W/NP warehouse in Managua and are being distributed. Bed sheets are much needed as the country had an earthquake. Both flat, fitted and pillowcases are needed and do not need to be matching sets.



One of the learning centers is for teaching of growing food. The ground is hard and stoney, so they would like garden forks, hoes, shovels. All garden tools are helpful.

The food learning center would like kitchen aid mixers, but these are very expensive. I bought a used food Mixmaster and 2 new hand mixers.

My husband and I will be delivering these items to Appleton, the Bolt Warehouse. Bolt warehouse is helping with transportation and also with storage of the mattresses.

Although they still need supplies for the home and women and children that reside at Safe Harbor. Vanessa also stated that they are in real need of Laundry supplies. All laundry detergent of any kind and size are welcome. Scented and unscented are welcome, as some people have allergic reactions to detergents. I have started to use the pods in my washer, so I have some larger bottles of liquid Cheer still on the shelf. I plan to donate the Cheer this next week. As Vanessa lives about 4 or 5 miles away from me, she said I could drop any donations at her home some evening. Another idea, if you happen to be at the Dollar Tree or Dollar Store many things can be bought for much less and still work fine. I stopped there to get a pail, which I filled with cleaning supplies, gloves, tooth paste, bubbles, & barrettes. FYI Vanessa said they do NOT need tooth brushes, as some of the dentists in the County are providing all the tooth bushes they need. My Challenge for each of us this next month, let's see how many items of Laundry we can supply Safe Harbor with for this next month.

Call to order by President Carolyn Dreier at 6:12 P.M. followed by the Association Creed read by Carolyn. Note....late start due to problem with link connection.

Secretary's minutes were reviewed by members prior to meeting. Two corrections noted. First was that Alice Walter donated \$20.00 to Stiches of Love program in memory of Joyce Riviers not \$25.00. Second was that Kathi Bonde name was incorrectly typed as Bonder in Cultural and Textile Arts report. With these corrections Joyce Kuhlow made motion to pass secretary's report and Kathi Bonde seconded it. Motion carried.

Roll call, present: Carolyn Dreier, Kathi Bonde, Julie Boedecker, Nancy Cherney, Kristine Miller, Joyce Kuhlow, Marilyn Voskuil, Sharon Zimmermann, Sharon Even, Nancy Wagner, Jane Jensen and Donna Zarovy (left early).

Treasurer's Report was read by Nancy Cherney. Motion made by Julie Boedecker to accept report and seconded by Joyce Kuhlow. Motion carried.

REPORTS OF OFFICERS & COMMITTEES:

Cultural & Textile Arts – Report from Peggy Berchem and read by Carolyn Dreier. Three members volunteered to assist Peggy at Rally Day in displaying and judging entries. They are Sharon Even, Nancy Wagner and Nancy Cherney. So far there are 19 entries. A complete report and registration form will be in the next Gold Notes.

Stiches of Love – Julie Boedecker reporting. The 2 cancer centers were given questionnaires regarding our program. Both wanted to continue with our donations but made no comment on how we could better serve them.

Family & Community Life – Joyce Kuhlow reporting. Vanessa VanderWeele from Safe Harbor has made a special request for Laundry supplies/soaps...any brand. They do not need tooth brushes. Brushes are donated from the county dentists.

Wisconsin Bookworms – Kris Miller reporting. Readers hope to be in the classrooms in fall, wearing masks. However, this could change.

There are approximately 180 children in the program and 191 sets of books ordered. We still need someone to replace Kris as chairperson. She states that Angie from Headstart is easy to work with. Motion made by Sharon Zimmermann and seconded by Joyce Kuhlow to donate \$1,000.00 to Headstart for the Wisconsin Bookworm program. Motion passed.

International – Alice Walter reporting. Alice will be taking donations to Appleton this week and next week for Nicaragua. There is a special request for any size bedding...sheets flat or fitted and pillowcases. There was a donation of many mattresses. Also requesting gardening supplies....tools such as shovels, forks, hoes, water hoses, etc. There will be a special article in Goldnotes.

Soil Mix for a 4'x8'x2' Raised Garden Bed

1½ yards of top soil - 40 cu feet.

0.7 yards of compost - 20 cu feet

0.4 yards of peat moss - 4 cu feet (You can substitute perlite or vermiculite)

Mix the topsoil, compost and peat moss together. Fill the bed with mixture
