The careful, creative, balanced use of recognition is an element of successful 4-H programs. Recognition is an acknowledgment and affirmation of the personal growth in an individual. It can be public or private. It can be within the individual or provided by others. Recognition in 4-H encourages and supports learning and growth. Recognition in 4-H has several purposes:

- To further motivate youth to excel, take risks, and develop new skills and abilities.
- To provide a strong foundation for each young person to engage in self-reflection To support efforts as they engage in individualized learning, group activities, and competition.
- To provide balance in feedback youth receive as they move to increasingly difficult tasks

Recognition is an incentive to further learning. Used properly, recognition can inspire and motivate young people to continue participating and learning. 4-H recognition should match the needs of the young people with whom we work. Different kids are motivated by different things in varying degrees. Therefore, it is important that we provide a variety of recognition opportunities through 4-H.

The **4-H Recognition Model** includes five types of recognition. It is important for adults who work with 4-Hers to provide a balance of all five types of appropriate recognition for all participants.

- **Participation:** Recognizing 4-Hers for participation in experiences acknowledges the importance of involvement and being part of a group.
- **Group Contribution:** Recognition for group contribution helps youth develop the interpersonal leadership and cooperative skills and abilities they will need to be successful in the interdependent, global society of the 21st century.
- **Progress Toward Goals:** Recognition of progress toward personal goals encourages youth to do realistic self-assessment and to set meaningful goals.
- **Achievement of Standards:** Recognition of achievement of standards of excellence gives youth external, predetermined targets for their learning experiences.
- Competitive Achievement: When planned and conducted appropriately, experiences in competition can enhance positive youth development and prepare young people with the sportsmanship and competitive knowledge, skills, attitudes, and aspirations needed for success as adults. However, when done inappropriately (for example, with children younger than age 9, who typically are not developmentally ready intellectually, emotionally, or socially to handle losing), competition can be negative for all concerned.

USING THE 4-H NAME & EMBLEM

Did you know? The 4-H Name & Emblem is a highly valued mark within our country's history. As such, it was granted a very unique and special status; it is in a category similar to the Presidential Seal and the Olympic Emblem. This federal protection makes it a mark in and of itself with protection that supersedes the limited authorities of both a trademark and a copyright.



I. Purpose of National 4-H logo

UW-MADISON EXTENSION

All usage of the 4-H Name and Emblem must be for educational or character building purposes, uphold the dignity of the 4-H Name, and provide a benefit to the 4-H Program. This means that all uses need to contribute to the appropriate learning and positive development of the youth and adults involved in the 4-H program while aligning with the principles of 4-H and positive youth development and/or refraining from anything that contradicts positive youth development. The use must support 4-H programming, provide a sense of belonging to the 4-H community, and the benefit to 4-H must be equal to or greater than the benefit received by the entity authorized. II. Wisconsin 4-H Logo

The logo for Wisconsin 4-H joins the UW-Madison logo to represent our connection to Campus. Further, it adds "Extension" to represent the Division of Extension's management of statewide 4-H functions. Extension is the sole coordinator of 4-H activities and, as such, its name must be in all uses of the logo. <u>View and download Wisconsin's 4-H logo</u>.

Using the 4-H Name and Emblem Quick Guide

UNDERSTANDING OUR 4-H TAX NUMBERS AND ID'S

FEIN is an acronym for **Federal Employer Identification Number**, also known as an EIN. This unique, nine-digit number is used by the IRS to identify a business operating in the United States. An **FEIN** is structured like this: XXXXXXXXX. An **FEIN** is a type of taxpayer identification number (TIN) used by certain businesses. All of our chartered 4-H Clubs and Groups have a unique EIN. This is used when opening bank accounts, filling taxes and receiving donations. For example the 4-H Leaders Association FEIN is 39-1265478 but each club has it's own EIN.

A **GEN** is an acronym for **Group Exemption Number** is a number indicating that the organization is recognized by the IRS as tax-exempt. The GEN is structured like this: ES XXXX. The IRS sometimes recognizes a group of organizations as tax-exempt if they are affiliated with a central organization. A group exemption letter from the IRS has the same effect as an individual exemption letter except that it applies to more than one organization. Donors may rely upon central organization (or UWS Board of Regents) verification with respect to deductibility of contributions to subordinates covered in a section 501(c)(3) group exemption ruling. Our clubs and groups are considered subordinates under the UWS Board of Regents and **we use GEN 5968.**

A CES or ES is an Acronym for a Certificate of Exempt Status. This is issued by the Department of Revenue in the State of Wisconsin. To assist retailers in identifying organizations that qualify to make purchases exempt from Wisconsin sales and use tax, the Department of Revenue will issue the qualifying nonprofit organization or governmental unit a Certificate of Exempt Status (CES) number. The Wisconsin 4-H Program is recognized as a program of the University of Wisconsin –System and utilizes the Wisconsin Tax Exemption Number of ES 40706. However, The Sheboygan County 4-H Leaders Association, Inc also files annually for a Charitable Organization Credential and this number is 13670-800.

4-H ALUMNI ASSOCIATION


The Sheboygan County 4-H Alumni Association would like to extend to you a one year free membership to recent 4-H graduates and new Alumni. 
Donations from participants: Around 300 community members came to donate hundreds of pounds of food and \$90 for the food pantry!

NANCY KISSEL SELECTED FOR NATIONAL 4-H HALL OF FAME

Nancy Kissel, a Wisconsin 4-H volunteer with more than sixty-five years of service has been selected to be inducted into the National 4-H Hall of

Fame. Kissel will be Wisconsin's first volunteer selected for this honor.

Kissel started a 4-H community club, serving as 4-H general leader for 35 years, and many more years as 4-H project leader. Her expansive 4-H volunteer contributions include roles at the county, state, and national levels. Kissel credits her 1970's part-time position as an urban expansion 4-H Staff Assistant, developing programs and organizing 4-H clubs for under served urban and minority populations, with further developing her leadership skills. Donna Menart nominated Kissel for the national honor. She says Kissel's character is evident in everything she does. "She lives the ideals of 4-H. Her contributions as a volunteer are impressive in longevity, but even more so in terms of the quality and depth of her ability to create sustaining systems that support the educational mission of 4-H on all levels," says Menart. "Her contributions have benefitted untold numbers of 4-H youth and adults."

"I am beyond thrilled to have a Wisconsin volunteer selected for the National Hall of Fame," says Kandi O'Neil, WI Volunteer Leadership Specialist." When I think of Nancy's impact on Wisconsin 4-H, I think of the horse project. As a volunteer, Nancy saw interested young people who wanted to learn about horses and may not be able to own a horse. By creating the Horseless Horse project, she was able to offer an opportunity for youth not only in Wisconsin but throughout the nation to learn about horses." Nancy served on the writing team for the national curriculum for Horseless Horse. State volunteer leadership roles have included: member of the WI State Horse Council, past president of the WI 4-HHorse Association and past director of the Midwest Horse Fair. Nancy's contributions as a volunteer are evident in the quality of educational programs for Wisconsin youth across the state. Her vision of finding a "yes" to what could have easily been a no has impacted untold numbers of youth across the country to be able to learn about horses.

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY DAIRY PROMOTION SCHOLARSHIPS

It's not too early to begin thinking about scholarships! The Sheboygan County Dairy Promotion Association will be offering up to three \$500 scholarships to Sheboygan County high school seniors enrolling in post-high school education (short course, technical college, 2-year or 4-year college) or for those currently enrolled in their first year of post highschool education. Eastern WI DHIC will be offering two scholarships to eligible youth for the upcoming school year. A \$500 scholarship will be offered to a high school senior enrolling in a one-year Ag-related program (i.e. short course,

technical school, etc.) A \$1000 scholarship will be awarded to a post-high school student currently enrolled in their first, second or third year of higher education in an Ag-related program. Applicant's <u>family does not have to be a member</u> of EWDHIC; however, applicants will need at least one recommendation from an EWDHIC member. WISCONSIN 4-H POLICY ... LET'S TAKE A CLOSER LOOK!

The Wisconsin 4-H Program is always evolving and we want to provide clear guidance to our leaders and members to ensure safety, security and support your efforts with our young people. In an effort to do this, I'd like to feature an article where we take a closer look at the Wisconsin 4-H Policies each month. Check out the updates, reminders and information here monthly!

The snow is about to fly!!! So let's take a look at out new Sledding, Tubing and Tobogganing Policy

Sledding, Tubing and Tobogganing Policy (New Policy)

4-H sledding and/or tubing activities must take place on a hill designated by a local municipality or other government entity as approved for that purpose or on the premises of a "ski area operator" as defined in Wisconsin Statute 167.33 OR at a hill that can meet all the relevant safety standards listed below and is approved by the 4-H Program Educator. A visual inspection at the site of the hill must take place prior to approval.



- Participants may not ride near roads, wooded areas, or bodies of water.
- Ensure the path is clear of rocks, sticks, poles, ice, permanent obstacles, and other potential hazards.




