All private applicators who require re-certification or individuals who wish to become certified for the first time should attend. DATCP certification extensions due to Covid-19 expire on December 31, 2021.

Certification is required for all private applicators who purchase or use "Restricted Use Pesticides." Because of the new Worker Protection Standard, employers may want to have employees who handle pesticides also become certified.
