Rules and Regulations for Poultry Project

Judging Day: Friday of the Fair

Judging Location: Rabbit/Poultry Barn

Judging Time: 8:00 a.m.

Judging Order: Showmanship
Breed Classes
Blue Ribbon Classes

Entry Limit: One exhibit per lot

Additional Rules of Entry:

1. Each entry will consist of a single bird (unless otherwise stated). Exhibitors will be responsible for the care and feeding of their exhibits. Coops will be provided.
2. Birds for production of breeding purposes are judged on the "**Standard Of Perfection**" for the breed. Market lots are judged on USDA market grades.
3. All exhibitors **MUST** attend at least **one County Poultry Meeting** in order to exhibit at the Fair. Meetings are usually held in January, March and June. Attendance will be taken and records kept by Poultry Superintendents.
4. **The American Standard of Perfection** for Poultry will be used in determining correct classification of the bird exhibited
5. All exhibitors must bring their birds in on Wednesday the week of the fair between 3:00 and 7:00 p.m.
6. Failure to feed, water and keep pens clean may result in loss of premiums.
7. Exhibitors are expected to be on hand for judging. The Danish System will be used.
8. All exhibitors entering poultry at the fair must verify that their entry is drug-free. Both the exhibitor and a parent may be asked to sign a statement indicating that the bird is drug-free when being brought to the Fair and will remain drug free while at the Fair.
9. All blood testing must be done by Saturday before the Fair, anything coming to the Fair without being tested **WILL BE SENT HOME**. For more information on blood testing contact:

10. If buying your bird from a hatchery or coop you may ask for and will receive a US Pullorum-Typhoid Free Certificate. Make sure it is for Pullorum-Typhoid, nothing else will do. Doing this will save everyone including you a lot of time.
11. You may enter under FFA or 4H, but **NOT BOTH**.
12. All birds must be healthy and dry at time of entry. Wet birds will be sent home.
13. If an exhibitor wishes to enter in the Blue ribbon Sale, at least 1 additional animal must be shown in a breed class
14. Showmanship is required to sell in Blue Ribbon Sale

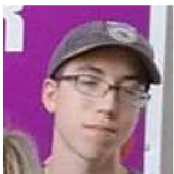

Blue Ribbon Small Animal Auction Sale

GOATS:	Dept. 5,	Class N	Lots 25-34
RABBITS:	Dept. 8,	Class X,	Lots 30-52
CAVIES:	Dept. 8	Class ZG,	Lots 12-15

Objectives:

1. To provide Junior Fair exhibitors an opportunity to sell top quality animals at the Sheboygan County Fair.
2. To provide incentive and encourage a stronger cavy, goat, poultry, and rabbit project.
3. To recognize members who do quality work in breeding, selecting, feeding, and showing their animals.

What will be offered:

1. Animals to be sold at auction will be only BLUE RIBBON entries as described in the Sheboygan County Fair paper. Only one blue ribbon entry in each lot will be selected to be auctioned, except for ducks, turkeys, and geese, where two will be sold.
2. All goat, rabbit, cavy and poultry entries must be born January 1 or after of that fair year. The goat may be a doe or a wether. Rabbits, cavies and poultry may be male or female.
3. All animals receiving top blues must be sold if sale eligible.
4. Enter your animal in the Blue Ribbon Animal Auction class only if you intend for it to be sold.

When is the sale?

1. The Blue Ribbon Small Animal Auction will be held on Monday in the coliseum.

Who can buy?

1. Anyone interested in encouraging youth participation.
2. Anyone who enjoys and appreciates good quality animals.
3. Anyone who would gain beneficial advertising value.

Sale Provisions:

1. Potential bidders registered at sales ring (no obligation) (Labor Day) at noon in the Coliseum
2. Animal weights will not be provided except for poultry. Bidding will be based on an entry basis.
3. Participants must present their own animal for the initial sale and for the resale, should it occur. Participants must remain in the sale arena throughout the entire sale. Failure to follow the rules will result in seller being barred from the sale the next year. Seller will receive auction money. If it happens a second time seller will be barred from the sale the remainder of seller's 4-H/FFA career. A committee member will present the animal for resale if the seller is not present.
4. Exhibitors are encouraged to find their own bidders for the sale.
5. Animals must be owned by the exhibitor or his/her family.
6. All entries must be drug free.
7. Goat exhibitors must provide a collar for their animal.
8. All exhibitors can expect to have animal ID's checked at check-in, show time and sale time.
9. Exhibitors are expected to dress appropriately.

Special requirements:

1. Entries are open to registered and enrolled 4-H and FFA members of Sheboygan County.
2. Make entries on regular county fair entry blank under BLUE RIBBON ANIMAL AUCTION class as noted in fair paper.
3. Exhibitors may enter a maximum of two entries in the Blue Ribbon Classes in Cavies, Goats, Poultry, or Rabbits, but each in a different lot. If both entries receive the top blue ribbon in their lots, the exhibitor must choose one to sell in the auction. Then, if the lot not chosen has another animal in it receiving a blue, that animal will be sold in the auction.
4. Sale will be conducted by the Sheboygan County 4-H Blue Ribbon Small Animal Auction Committee. A 12.5% charge will be deducted from the sale to cover committee expenses such as advertising and sale promotions.
5. All sold animals will be released at time of sale to buyer.
6. Exhibitors may enter cavies, goats, poultry, and rabbits in the same class, but only one per project may be sold.
7. After the sale, all sellers will receive a copy of the purchase agreement. Please see your project superintendent.
8. Exhibitors will be given two (2) weeks after the fair for the committee and the buyer to receive thank you notes. If no thank you is received exhibitor will be barred from the sale the next year. Exhibitor will receive their auction money. If

a thank you is not received a second time, exhibitor will be barred from the sale the remainder of the exhibitor's 4-H/FFA career.

9. Animals donated back by the buyer will be resold only once and at the end of the auction. Proceeds will go to the Blue Ribbon Small Animal Auction Treasury.

10. Unsportsmanlike or other inappropriate conduct by the exhibitor or parents will not be tolerated. The Blue Ribbon Committee reserves the right to refuse participation in the sale by individuals not conducting themselves in the appropriate manner.

11. In order to be eligible for the Blue Ribbon Auction, Goat Project members must participate in at least two countywide goat meetings and Cavy, Poultry and Rabbit Project members must participate in at least one countywide meeting. Read the Cloverleaf Crier for information on various activities.

12. If an exhibitor wishes to enter in the Blue Ribbon Sale, at least 1 additional animal must be shown in a breed class.

13. **Blue Ribbon Auction participants** are required to do showmanship in order to sell at the sale. You **MUST** enter on your **FAIR ENTRY FORM**.

14. Seller is responsible for making arrangements with buyer for transfer of animal after sale.
