Sheboygan County youth have TWO MEMBERSHIP OPTIONS to join 4-H program. As always youth may enroll in one of 27 strong "multi-project clubs" our program supports OR they may join through a Special Interest(SPIN) Membership.

SPIN Membership allows youth to belong to 4-H, build friendships, master new skills, practice independence, and give back to their community through one of our strong county-wide projects. As a SPIN Member, a young person will enroll and select one (or more) of the county-wide projects to participate in. SPIN members will meet their needs for belonging and leadership through the county-wide project experiences rather than with a year-long club.

In addition to participating and completing all of the required countywide project experiences, 4-H SPIN Members must also:

- 1. Complete a 4-H Project Record Page and submit it to the UW-Extension Staff before September 30th of the program year. Failure to complete this record will prohibit re-enrollment as a SPIN member.
- 2. Participate in a show, competition, demonstration or other event showcasing the content or skills learned throughout participation in the project. This may or may not be the Sheboygan County Fair.
- 3. 4-H SPIN Membership costs \$20 per member or \$50 per family payable to the Sheboygan County 4-H Leaders Association. These funds will be allocated to the 4-H Leaders Association General Fund in lieu of countywide fundraising (i.e. Pizza Sale and Fair Foodstand). This fee is in addition to any specific project fees paid to the chartered project.
- 4. Agree to and follow all expectations and policies of the Sheboygan County 4-H Program.

There are definitely pros and cons for both of these membership options. Both options provide young people an opportunity for belonging, mastery, independence and generosity. Families need options and Sheboygan County 4-H will deliver! CLUB DECISION MAKING CORNER

This is a corner of the Crier to offer suggestions and tips in leading your club and project meetings. Sometimes I'll share Parliamentary Procedure Practices and other times I might give a little tip about how to engage your members at your next meeting. I hope you enjoy these and please let me know how these suggestions work for you!

One way to ensure that even some of your "quieter" members get a chance to share is to use **the THINK-PAIR-SHARE** strategy. Here's how . . .

Prompt the group to think, <u>on their own</u>, about (and write down) their response to the question. When prompted, have them find a partner and share their thoughts with them. When prompted again, have each pair find another pair and share the ideas within a group of four.

Ex: What activities would you like to do for our winter party? What would you like the theme for our silent auction basket to be?

WISCONSIN 4-H POLICY ... LET'S TAKE A CLOSER LOOK!

The Wisconsin 4-H Program is always evolving and we want to provide clear guidance to our leaders and members to ensure safety, security and support your efforts with our young people. In an effort to do this, I'd like to feature an article where we take a closer look at the Wisconsin 4-H Policies each month. Check out the updates, reminders and information here monthly!



Downhill Skiiing and Snowboarding Policy

4-H clubs and groups may participate in downhill skiing and snowboarding at premises of a "ski area operator" as defined in <u>Wisconsin Statute 167.33.</u>

4-H youth leaders, adult volunteers and/or staff must develop a safety plan referring to the Alpine Activities tip sheet for additional information.

Safety Plan — Identify 4-H staff or volunteer(s) who will:

- Check and monitor weather conditions to ensure appropriate conditions prior to and during the activity.
- Review appropriate clothing and gear.
- Assist participants to identify their ability level and direct them toward appropriate lessons, terrain, and lifts.
- Review the ski area map with participants and identify a designated meeting spot.
- Review safety rules with participants including the National Ski Area Association (NSAA) "Your Responsibility Code,". All skiers and riders must follow any additional rules of the facility.
- Consider additional topics including: accident insurance, risk management checklist, etc.

Participation Requirements

- All participants are required to wear a protective helmet with properly fitting chinstrap (regardless of the facility's policy).
- Participants will review the ski area map and designate a meeting spot.
- Participants must ski or ride with at least one other person.
- Each individual engaged in skiing and snowboarding activities MUST follow the following safety rules as outlined in <u>Wisconsin Statute 167.33</u>:
 - Obey all posted warnings and signs.
 - Keep off of closed trails and out of closed areas.
 - Know the range of his or her ability and engage in skiing within that ability.
 - Assess the difficulty of the trails and terrains that are open to skiing.
 - Maintain control of his or her speed and direction.
 - Be able to stop or avoid other individuals or objects.
 - Yield to other individuals engaged in skiing who are ahead or who are down the slope.
 - Not stop at a point that will result in the individual obstructing a trail or not being visible from above.

- Yield to other individuals engaged in skiing who are uphill when starting downhill or merging onto a trail.
- Be able to safely board, ride, and deboard any lift serving an area open to skiing.
- Board and deboard a lift only at designated sites.
- If involved in a collision with another participant in an alpine sport that results in injury or death, not leave the vicinity of the collision before giving his or her name and current address to an employee of the ski area operator or a member of the ski patrol, except for the purpose of securing aid for a person injured in the collision. A person who leaves the scene of the collision for the purpose of securing aid shall give his or her name and current address after securing the aid.
- If renting or contracting with a public or private hill, all riders must also follow the rules of the facility.

SHOOTING SPORTS LEADERS NEEDED!

A Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports Leader may be certified in archery, coordinator, muzzleloader, pistol, rifle and shotgun disciplines. Leaders may only teach in the discipline in which they are certified. An adult leader cannot provide hands-on or safety instruction without a 4-H certified leader supervising the range.

Requirements for Attending an Adult Certification Workshop:

- 1. Be an approved 4-H leader in your county through 4-H Online
- 2. Age 21 or older.

3. National 4-H Shooting Sport Online training completed. (Only need to complete it once.)

4. Register for a certification workshop of choice through 4-H Online and pay fee (only one certification can be obtained at a Saturday workshop)

5. Attend the complete 8 hours of a Saturday certification workshop.

YQCA CERTIFICATION Youth in Livestock Projects



YQCA is designed as an annual education and certification program focused on food safety, animal well-being and character awareness for youth ages 8 to 21 producing and/or showing pigs, beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, goats, market rabbits, and poultry. The program has been designed by extension specialists and national livestock program managers to ensure it is accurate, current and relevant to the needs of the animal industry and shows and is appropriate for youth. Completion of YQCA is a requirement to sell in the 2022 Sheboygan County Meat Animal Sale and if you are planning to exhibit your animals, including poultry, at the Wisconsin State Fair. If you are a youth in the beef, sheep or swine projects in Sheboygan County, you must complete this training and turn in your certificate to the Meat Animal Sale Committee in order to meet one of your education requirements for sale eligibility.

The Sheboygan County General Livestock Committee and the Sheboygan County Meat Animal Sale Committee have held lengthy discussions as to how to hold this training in person this year. However, due to several concerns it has been decided that YQCA training will be 100% on line this year. 4-H LIVESTOCK AND SKILL-A-THON CONTEST AND THE STATE 4-H MEATS JUDGING CONTEST

Mark your calendars for the upcoming 4-H Livestock and Skill-athon Contest and the State 4-H Meats Judging Contest! If you have participated in the past or this is the first time you are hearing about the contest, we would love to have you join us for this day of learning, fun, and competition!

What are the contests? These are three different contests all about livestock where you can use your knowledge about the animal species (beef, sheep, swine, meat goat) and the industry.

Livestock Quiz Bowl: Livestock Bowl is a quiz competition where all the questions are about beef, sheep, swine, and meat goat topics. Students use a buzzer to answer the questions (similar to the game show Jeopardy). Teams compete in a double

elimination format by giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. Each match has both an individual and toss-up question round. The top team earns the opportunity to compete at the national competition.

Livestock Skill-a-thon: Everything you know about raising your animal adds up to so much knowledge of the species and the industry. The Skill-a-thon contest will help you challenge you to share that information through a written quiz and learning stations such as breed identification, feed identification, equipment identification as well as some team activities such as demonstrating evaluation skills. The top team earns the opportunity to compete at the national competition.

Meats Judging Contest: Have you been to your local meat market or grocery store lately and think you could choose the best cut of meat out of the case? Have you ever watched a live animal contest and thought you could choose what animals would provide the best meat products? This is your opportunity to put those skills to work. This contest tests the knowledge of youth in the placement of carcass and retail cut classes, carcass grading, retail cut identification, and a quiz. Top teams earn the opportunity to compete at regional and national competitions.

Who can participate? Any current 4-H members ages 8-18. Please note, there are age divisions for each of those contests.
