TIPS FOR ONLINE FAIR ENTRY!

Read carefully! It is your responsibility to know and understand the rules! This summary is for your convenience however it is not intended to be all inclusive.

Make sure to review all fair entry rules by reading pages 3-5 of the Sheboygan County Fair Entry Book (each club will be provided 1 hard copy). Also read the section entitled, Additional Rules of Entry within each department. FIRST – Review Fair Entry Rules (Questions? Contact Fair Manager at 920.893.5751 or stop in Fair Office)

SECOND - Review the projects you are enrolled in by going to: <u>https://v2.4honline.com/</u> (FFA MEMBERS CAN ALSO ENROLL HERE for up-to-date project meeting information and requirements!)

WHO MAY EXHIBIT? Members in good standing in a 4-H Club or FFA of Sheboygan County who are in grades 3-13. **Grade is based on your current grade as of <u>January 1.ª of exhibit year</u>** You are expected to know your child's grade! Per WI State 4-H Policies: 4-H membership is open to all youth beginning in 5K (five-year-old Kindergarten) through one year beyond high school graduation and not to extend beyond the age of 19 as of December 31 of the enrollment year.

THIRD - Follow the 3 Steps provided at http://www.shebcofair.com/exhibitors.html no later than July 15th

After creating an account on the fair entry page, you will receive an e-mail confirming each account. This is the first e-mail you will receive in this process. EVERYONE will make a new account each year. Avoid creating two accounts within one year.



STRONGLY RECOMMENDED: REVIEW ENTRIES WITH YOUR 4-H Club Leader or FFA Advisor by July 1 # before "submitting" entries on-line. You can do this by taking a screenshot or scanning a copy of the PENDING ENTRIES and send separately to your leader. NOTE: Once you hit SUMBIT, your entries are complete and CANNOT be changed through the website, you must contact the fair office. Again, items CANNOT be REMOVED once the SUBMIT button is hit. Additions to entries can be made up until the entry deadline.

Clubs must provide all members with a leader e-mail address to complete the entry process. FFA Members, please include your FFA Advisor's e-mail. This will ensure that entries are sent to a Club Fair Entry Leader for verification. Projects that require additional verification in the Fair Entry Process (i.e. Horse and Pony Project) will provide a secondary e-mail address for confirmation of entry and accuracy of enrollment.

Club Fair Entry Leaders and Project Leaders are not responsible for catching errors that are made in the entry process but will help to ensure that members are entered on time and in accordance with project rules.

FINAL STEP- Once you hit "SUBMIT" you will receive an e-mail confirming that your entry is complete. This will be a second e-mail in the process. If you do not receive an e-mail listing all of your entries, you have not hit SUBMIT! DO NOT LEAVE items PENDING!

The Fair Entry Deadline of July 15th is strictly observed

In order to receive premiums, Junior Fair exhibitors must be enrolled in the youth organization and the projects in which they are exhibiting by the following deadlines:

ANIMAL RELATED and SHOOTING PROJECTS

March 1st of the Exhibit Year

ALL NON- ANIMAL PROJECTS

May 1st of the Exhibit Year

- Exhibits must be the member's own work, completed during the current 4-H year and they must exhibit their • own entry. No sibling, friend, parent or other individual may show a members project.
- All Animal Exhibits entered in the wrong department, class or lot number will be disgualified. The project will not be judged and no premium or ribbon will be awarded.

All Non-Animal Projects entered in the wrong department, class or lot number may be brought to the fair will receive NO PREMIUM, may be judged for ribbon placing ONLY and will be placed on display.

CLUB DECISION MAKING CORNER

This is a corner of the Crier to offer suggestions and tips in leading your club and project meetings. Sometimes I'll share Parliamentary Procedure Practices and other times I might give a little tip about how to engage your members at your next meeting. I hope you enjoy these and please let me know how these suggestions work for you!

Steps for Decision Making under Parliamentary Procedure

- 1. Motion A motion is a request that something be done or that something is the opinion or wish of the group. Only one motion should be placed before the group at one time. It is debatable and amendable.
- 2. Second Someone from the group must "second" the motion (agree to the motion) so that is can be discussed.
- 3. Discussion The motion "on the floor" is discussed by all members, addressing the pros and cons, etc.
- 4. **Restate the motion –** The president restates the motion before the group votes.
- 5. Vote The group votes by voice yes/no; by show of hands; by standing; by secret ballot; or by roll call vote.

WISCONSIN 4-H POLICY ... LET'S TAKE A CLOSER LOOK!

The Wisconsin 4-H Program is always evolving and we want to provide clear guidance to our leaders and members to ensure safety, security and support your efforts with our young people. In an effort to do this, I'd like to feature an article where we take a closer look at the Wisconsin 4-H Policies each month. Check out the updates, reminders and information here monthly!

Chartered 4-H Clubs and 4-H Groups must retain their nonprofit status. Excess funds can cause a 4-H Club or Group to unintentionally become a private foundation as defined by the IRS.

Excess 4-H funds are a 4-H Club or Group's monies that exceed the maximum limits outlined below. Clubs or groups with less than \$2,000 do not have excess funds.

Calculate if a 4-H Club or Group has excess funds using the steps below. You will need Annual Financial Reports from the last three years.

- 1. Find the average of the last three years' annual expenses for the 4-H Club or Group
- 2. Add the value of Box C (Total expenses) from the Annual Financial Report for the last three years. (Example: \$1,800 + \$700 + \$1,100 = \$3,600.)
- 3. Divide the total by three (3). This is the average annual expense. (Example: $3,600 \div 3 = 1,200$. 1,200 is the average annual expense.)
- 4. Multiply the average annual expense by two (2) to calculate the maximum limit of money the club or group can hold. (Example: $1,200 \times 2 = 2,400$. $2,400 \times 2 = 1,200 \times 2 =$
- 5. Compare the maximum limit to the Ending Balance (Box D) on the most recent Annual Financial Report.
 - If Box D is greater than the maximum limit AND has over \$2,000, the club or group has excess funds.
 - If Box D is less than the maximum limit or less than \$2,000, the 4-H Club or Group does not have excess funds.

Chartered 4-H Clubs and Groups cannot hold excess 4-H funds.

If a club or group finds that they have excess funds, that money can be saved for a specific programmatic objective; however, there must be a 5-Year Plan that has been approved by the 4-H Program Educator. (See 4-H Excess Funds and 5-Year Plan Document) If the programmatic objective will take longer than 5 years, the 4-H Program Educator AND the Wisconsin 4-H Associate Program Director must grant approval of the plan.
