
What can you do to help make sure this awesome day happens?

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY YOUTH CONSERVATION POSTER CONTEST

Sheboygan County is reviving our annual youth conservation poster contest this year, so we are trying to spread the word and thought that some students in 4-H might be interested in participating.



The purpose of the poster contest is to provide an opportunity for young people to become more aware of the conservation of our natural resources through artistic design. Please see the attached flier with basic contest rules as well as an **entry form** that must be completed & signed by a guardian/parent and placed on the backside of each poster. This year's contest theme is "One Water" and focuses on the idea that waterways are connected throughout the entire watershed and are connected regardless of whether they are upstream, downstream or on the coast.

The deadline for entry in the county contest is Thursday, January 19th, 2022. Entries can be delivered to our office at 508 New York Ave, Sheboygan, WI. If you need assistance getting the posters to our office, please let me know and we can make arrangements for pick up. All entries will receive a participation certificate and the top winners in each division will receive a prize. The first-place poster in each division will move on to the Area Contest to compete with neighboring counties. Winners at the area level will then advance to the state and potentially national level.

SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS

BILL JEN'S 4-H ALUMNI GRANT

The Sheboygan County 4-H Alumni has grant money available for youth needing some financial support that wants to attend out-of-county, state, or national trips or events. This grant was made from gifted monies from a donor who wanted to help kids go places but could not because of the family's financial hardship. Examples: American Spirit trip, CWF, 4-H camp, Drama Company, etc. We would like leaders or parents to comment on the needs of the event. (Example: a family of 5 or with other help from 4-H sources & the alumni my child can have the opportunity to see Washington or go on the American Spirit trip.)

Applications are found on the UW Extension site under Alumni. Make sure you check it out. We want kids to have as many experiences as possible. It does not matter if it's going to camp, doing quiz bowl, going on a national trip to Washington, or whatever.

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY DAIRY PROMOTION SCHOLARSHIPS

It's not too early to begin thinking about scholarships! The Sheboygan County Dairy Promotion Association will be offering up to three \$500 scholarships to Sheboygan County high school seniors enrolling in post-high school education (short course, technical college, 2-year or 4-year college) or for those currently enrolled in their first year of post-high school education. EASTERN WI DHIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Eastern WI DHIC will be offering two scholarships to eligible youth for the upcoming school year. A \$500 scholarship will be offered to a high school senior enrolling in a one-year Ag-related program (i.e. short course, technical school, etc.) A \$1000 scholarship will be awarded to a post-high school student currently enrolled in their first, second or third year of higher education in an Ag-related program. Applicant's <u>family does not have to be a member</u> of EWDHIC; however, applicants will need at least one recommendation from an EWDHIC member. WISCONSIN PORK ASSOCIATION OFFERS SCHOLARSHIPS

The Wisconsin Pork Association is offering scholarships to high school seniors and college students. Students with a sincere interest in the swine industry are encouraged to apply. The applications can be found at www.wppa.org/scholarships. The application deadline will be December 1st. Some of the scholarships have certain requirements of eligibility, for example, the Whitmore is selected through the 3 WI universities (UWP, UWM, and UWRF). The Fredrich scholarship is for youth in the SE part of WI.

CLUB DECISION-MAKING CORNER

This is a corner of the Crier to offer suggestions and tips in leading your club and project meetings. Sometimes I'll share Parliamentary Procedure Practices and other times I might give a little tip about how to engage your members at your next meeting. I hope you enjoy these and please let me know how these suggestions work for you!



There are many different kinds of **Motions** when using Parliamentary Procedure: *Privileged Motions, Subsidiary Motions, Main Motions, and Incidental Motions* to name a few. Let's start at the very beginning, well what most people would consider the beginning...

What is the Main Motion? A motion that brings business before the group and which can be made only while no other motion is pending. "I move we have a banquet." That's it! It's just a suggestion that the group does something and gets the ball rolling to discuss it. If no one makes a motion, then you don't have anything to discuss. Main motions can come from any member, officer, committee, or subcommittee.

WISCONSIN 4-H POLICY ... LET'S TAKE A CLOSER LOOK!

The Wisconsin 4-H Program is always evolving and we want to provide clear guidance to our leaders and members to ensure safety, and security and support your efforts with our young people. In an effort to do this, I'd like to feature an article where we take a closer look at the Wisconsin 4-H Policies each month. Check out the updates, reminders, and information here monthly!

Holiday Season, Christmas Season, Hanukkah Season . . . Oh My! What is the policy that talks about Religion and Wisconsin 4-H? Here is the language:

As a program of the University of Wisconsin – Madison, Wisconsin 4-H prohibits discrimination in all its programs and activities on the basis of race, color, national origin, gender, religion, age, disability, political beliefs, and marital or family status. As a result, 4-H programs are focused on education and must not advance a particular religion. Explicitly or implicitly requiring religion or religious practices as a condition for participation in 4-H club meetings creates a barrier for participation and is prohibited.

This pilot schedule will be reviewed throughout the year and after one year to determine its impact on the organization and the board's effectiveness. 4-H VOLUNTEER TRAINING

I know that volunteering for the youth of Sheboygan County is not something you take lightly and it is not something that you do as a full-time job. Sometimes the added responsibilities of training and paperwork can be perceived as a cumbersome obstacle to just "being there for kids" which is what we all want you to be able to do. I do take seriously my role of helping you to navigate your volunteers' roles and responsibilities in a palatable and even fun way through this 4-H program. I believe that volunteering should be both fun and rewarding for the youth and the adults in our program.

<u>Here's what UW-Extension says:</u> All 4-H programs and activities must be supervised by a staff member or an approved 4-H volunteer, 18 years of age or older, who has completed all the following steps:

Step 1: Enroll in 4-H Online including agreeing to the Division of Extension Volunteer Behavior Expectations.

- Learn more about volunteering for UW-Madison Division of Extension
- Understand how to build safe spaces for youth & volunteers
- Discover the history and philosophies of 4-H
- Gain resources and tools that you can use in your volunteer role

Step 2: Complete Criminal Background Check* (information will be sent via email to all new potential volunteers once a person has enrolled)

^{*}A background records check for arrest and conviction records will be completed every four years for continuing 4-H volunteer leaders.

^{**}Returning volunteers who have been absent for one to four years need a background record to check, a **signed Volunteer Behavior Expectations** form, and an Assumption of Risk but are not required to attend the orientation to be reinstated as a volunteer. Returning volunteers who have been absent for over four years need to repeat the entire Youth Protection process.

The team members teach seminars and train to be peer leaders for county and regional events including Fall Forum. The 4-H Arts Team is led by a professional artist who teaches team members artistic techniques using a variety of mediums.

Program Leaders, and others who determine 4-H programs. At the same time, the conference is a rich and meaningful experience for the youth and adult participants. Held at a Washington DC area hotel (Hyatt Regency in Arlington, VA), it's usually scheduled around the beginning of April. In 2019, there were approximately 350 delegates, including seven from Wisconsin.

4-H Club Meetings

Almost every 4-H club holds **regular** club meetings. Even within the same club, no two club meetings are the same. Ideally, every meeting should have three parts—**recreation** (**fun**), **business**, and **learning**. Youth leadership plays a huge role in the success of a club.

Most clubs have youth officers (president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and other selected roles) who are responsible for running each meeting. Youth leaders not only gain excellent life skills, they help to keep the meeting relevant and fun for members of all ages. All youth have a responsibility to contribute to their clubs through their voice and their actions!

What is my role as an adult?

Adults help create a safe, positive atmosphere for all 4-H members when they empower and encourage youth. While at a meeting, it's important to be a positive role model for everyone in attendance. Caring adults play an important role in the mental health of youth, and 4-H can help connect youth with positive adults.

- 1. Actively listen to all 4-H members.
- 2. Let youth run the meeting. It's their club!
- 3. Attend as many meetings as possible.
- 4. Ask your club leader how you can help.
- 5. If you have a hobby or skill, consider offering to be a guest speaker!

Should I stay or should I go?

It's strongly recommended that parents/guardians attend the 4-H meeting with your child. Club meetings provide great opportunities to learn with other club members, but the learning doesn't stop there. By attending the meeting, you can reflect on the meeting together and continue the education outside the club.
