
4-H THRIVING SURVEY RESULTS FROM 2022



4-H Thriving Model Program Quality Scores Sheboygan County 2022

The 4-H Thriving Model predicts that youth who participate in 4-H programs that provide a high-quality developmental context will thrive, and thriving youth achieve key developmental outcomes.

To determine scores for Program Quality, youth members age 13 and up were invited to take an online survey asking them questions about their 4-H experience. Sheboygan County results include responses from 56 youth. The survey was developed by Mary Arnold, Oregon State University and Ryan Gagnon, Clemson University. Wisconsin served as a pilot state for administering the survey in 2020 & 2021. The results shared in this brief were from surveys completed in 2022. After analyzing data, the scores are provided which assess each component of the model on a scale of 1-7, 7 meaning outstanding program quality.



Implications:

In Sheboygan County 4-H our young people are largely making great decisions and choosing to do the right thing. In fact, 91% of youth who responded to the survey agreed that they feel it is important for them to do the right thing and 90% indicate that they follow the rules when they are in a public setting, feel it is important for them to do their best and feel that if they keep working at something they will get better at it. This is one of the reasons that our program rated 5.6 out of 7 in the area of Youth Belonging. The Youth Belonging outcome of the survey measures how safe, welcome, and supported youth feel in 4-H programs.

The series of questions that measured the extent to which adults in the program help youth see new possibilities, push them to reach higher goals and hold them accountable provided an overall rating of 5.5 out of in Challenging Growth. This is an incredible opportunity for our program to strengthen. We want young people to thrive, and to do that they need to develop an intrinsic desire and willingness to try new challenges.

Personal Flotation Devices (PFDs), sometimes called "life jackets," are critical to waterfront activities at Upham Woods. Last year over 4,600 youth used Upham Woods PFDs! With an average lifespan of 10 years, these PFDs kept over **46,000 kids** safe on the water.

Canoeing, kayaking, and the many waterfront activities are Upham Woods are favorites of Sheboygan County Campers. The following sizes and quantities of Onyx life jackets are needed.

Child (33-55 lbs.): 30 at \$17.50 each Youth (55-88 lbs.): 60 at \$17.50 each Adult (90+ lbs.): 50 at \$17.50 each The entire purchase of 140 PFDs will cost \$2,450.

Every year, Wisconsin 4-H brings youth from around the world to stay with a host family for four weeks of the summer. Students are matched with a family who has a child of similar age and gender to become their host sibling and share their culture with their student. Host families and delegates are matched based on shared interests. Students are between the ages of 12-18, depending on the program, with the majority being 12-15 years old. The students are accompanied by adult chaperones, who stay with separate host families. These families do not need to have children living with them, so there is an opportunity for everyone to host!

By hosting an international delegate this summer, families will:

- Gain appreciation for another person and their culture
- Increase cross-cultural awareness and understanding
- Better understand their own culture while learning about another
- Form lasting friendships and create unforgettable memories

This experience focuses on 'everyday American family life,' so no special plans or trips are required! The visiting youth are excited to spend time with your family and will introduce your family to their culture too. Your children will have the opportunity to make a lifelong friend from abroad and have an unforgettable summer they will be excited to share about!

Dates vary by program and are listed below:

- Norway: June 23 July 20, 2023 (delegates 15-18 years old)
- Japan: July 23 August 16, 2023 (delegates 12-16 years old)

Leaders will take an in-depth look into the results of the Thriving Youth Survey and share strategies for effective club and project work with each other. This is one of only TWO opportunities that are currently offered for our club leaders each year. All adult club leaders are welcome – those who have retired from their club as well as those who are currently serving.

CLUB DECISION-MAKING CORNER

This is a corner of the Crier to offer suggestions and tips in leading your club and project meetings. Sometimes I'll share Parliamentary Procedure Practices and other times I might give a little tip about how to engage your members at your next meeting. I hope you enjoy these and please let me know how these suggestions work for you!

Lots of decisions are made about money in 4-H. These are very important decisions and help young people learn about the value of money and how the "economy or 4-H" works. Here are some helpful reminders along with a link to additional valuable resources.

General Practices for 4-H Club Treasurers

- The treasurer position in a 4-H Club is a youth position. This is a valuable youth leadership role.
- Checks should require 2 signatures: the club treasurer and an adult volunteer leader. The two signatories should not be related to each other. Avoid having a parent-child as both signatories.
- Use good money handling practices:
 - Write a receipt for all monies received. The receipt should include the amount, source of the funds (such as a car wash or plat book sale), the date, and the name of the person making the payment. Receipts are back-up records for bank deposits made. Receipts should become a permanent part of the club files.
 - Deposit all monies into the bank account promptly.
 - Pay all bills promptly.
- Members need to approve payments. This is done through the approved budget. If the payment is outside the approved budget, a vote is needed by the membership at the next meeting.
- A payment approval form should be used and the receipt from the purchase should be attached.
- Financial records should be kept up-to-date and reported at each 4-H Club or Group meeting.

Discuss Money with Your 4-H Club or Group

- Members should vote on dues annually.
- Members should decide if fund raising is needed to have funds for their planned activities.
- Members should approve a budget.

Funds raised and donated in the name of 4-H are publicly accountable and must be used for 4-H educational purposes. Youth and adult volunteers handling 4-H money follow all <u>Wisconsin 4-H Financial Policies</u> and federal and state laws. Learn more at: <u>https://4h.extension.wisc.edu/money-management/</u>

WISCONSIN 4-H POLICY ... LET'S TAKE A CLOSER LOOK!

The Wisconsin 4-H Program is always evolving and we want to provide clear guidance to our leaders and members to ensure safety, security and support your efforts with our young people. In an effort to do this, I'd like to feature an article where we take a closer look at the Wisconsin 4-H Policies each month. Check out the updates, reminders and information here monthly!

Excess 4-H Funds Policy

4-H Clubs and 4-H Groups must practice financial policies that retain their nonprofit status and prevents them from accidentally falling into a private foundation status with the IRS. This is the primary purpose for the policy on excess funds and the 5 year plan.

All 4-H Clubs and 4-H Groups must use a cash accounting method. 4-H Clubs and groups are expected to be raising money for the next fiscal year, while spending money that was raised in the previous fiscal year. This means that a 4-H Club and Group may have obligations to pay for expenses that have not been fulfilled, while it is taking in cash receipts for fundraising.

For the purposes of this policy, "excess 4-H funds" are assets in excess of a chartered 4-H Club/Unit/Group's projected expenditures for two years, or \$1,000, whichever is greater. Chartered 4-H Clubs/Units/Groups shall hold no excess 4-H funds, unless that money is being saved for a specific programmatic objective that must be accomplished within five years and has been approved by the county 4-H staff member. (See 4-H Excess Funds and 5-Year Plan Document)

- c. 4-H members are eligible to receive only one scholarship from the Sheboygan County 4-H Leaders Association.

Volunteering: How Can You Help?

Volunteers are a huge part of the success of 4-H and help make 4-H possible. 4-H volunteers can serve as club leaders, project leaders, chaperones, and other roles. While the experience level of volunteers varies, our volunteers have one thing in common: wanting to make a positive difference in the lives of young people. In addition to making a positive impact with youth, 4-H volunteers gain important life skills of their own and also impact the communities in which they volunteer.

Becoming a 4-H Volunteer

To ensure volunteers in the 4-H program are prepared and to protect the safety and best interests of 4-H members, all 4-H volunteers who are 18 years of age and older who are no longer members go through a process which includes:

1. Participate in training to help you serve in your role. This training is called Volunteers in Preparation.

- 2. Have a background check.
- 3. Agree to conduct yourself in a way that positively represents 4-H.
- Learn how to keep our youth safe by taking a Mandated Reporter Training.

To get started on your volunteer journey, contact your local 4-H educator.

Wisconsin 4-H Volunteer Roles

There are many ways to volunteer in 4-H. All volunteers work with youth and adult volunteers to offer a positive youth development experience for youth. Wisconsin's 4-H program has six main roles for volunteers.

- Activity/Event Volunteers lead or organize a 4-H activity or event.
- Adult Advisor/Chaperones work with 4-H educators to chaperone a 4-H educational experience.
- · Club Enrollment Coordinator leads and supports enrollment in a club or group.
- Club Leader provides leadership for a club or group organization.
- Committee Volunteers help lead or participate as a member of a committee.
- Project Leaders provide leadership and organization to a group learning about a specific topic.
- There may be additional trainings to volunteer in some of these roles, for example a WI 4-H Shooting Sports Leader

Can I help without volunteering?

Not everyone feels ready to become a 4-H volunteer. Check in with your club leader or local 4-H educator to find out other ways you can still make an impact on the program without serving 4-H in an official capacity. This might mean providing no-contact support in a warm welcoming way such as bringing a healthy snack, set up and clean up, detc. Any help you give makes the experience more positive for everyone.

Helping Hands

The 4-H pledge talks about using your hands for larger service. Not only can you use your hands to help your club through leadership and teaching, but you can use your hands to help your community too! 4-H members are known for helping their community through service. Plan your own community service project by answering the questions below!

Who needs (or would benefit from) help?

Choose an organization (example: animal shelter or food pantry), group of people (people who are elderly), or a person who you'd like to help (a neighbor).

How can I help?

List skills (example: art or building), interests (being outside), or abilities (talking to other people) that you want to use to make a difference.

What tasks need to get done?

Match the "how" with the "who"! Write what you need to do to complete your project and the supplies you'll need to accomplish it. (Example: If you are creating cards for people in a senior living facility, you will need to contact the facility, gather writing supplies, create the cards, and deliver the cards.)

How did it go?

After you've done your community service project, reflect on how things went and how you might do things differently if you did it again. What went well? What could be better?

Almost every club does a community service project. At your next club meeting, ask a club officer or your club leader what project your club is doing this year!
