Livestock Quiz Bowl is a quiz competition where all the questions are about beef, sheep, swine, and meat goat topics. The students use a buzzer in order to answer the questions.

Skillathon is a contest made up of a written quiz and learning stations such as breeds, feedstuffs, and equipment identification as well as some team activities which demonstrate evaluation skills.

Competition in these events encourages 4-H members to develop a more complete knowledge of animals and related subjects. These youth have been meeting weekly since early January to prepare for these contests along with spending time outside of practices reviewing materials.

Our champion senior quiz bowl team qualified to compete at the National 4-H Livestock Quiz Bowl competition held in Louisville at the North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE) in November. Every year, Wisconsin 4-H brings youth from around the world to stay with a host family for four weeks of the summer. Students are matched with a family who has a child of similar age and gender to become their host sibling and share their culture with their student. Host families and delegates are matched based on shared interests. Students are between the ages of 12-18, depending on the program, with the majority being 12-15 years old. The students are accompanied by adult chaperones, who stay with separate host families. These families do not need to have children living with them, so there is an opportunity for everyone to host!

By hosting an international delegate this summer, families will:

- Gain an appreciation for another person and their culture
- Increase cross-cultural awareness and understanding
- Better understand their own culture while learning about another
- Form lasting friendships and create unforgettable memories

This experience focuses on 'everyday American family life,' so no special plans or trips are required! The visiting youth are excited to spend time with your family and will introduce your family to their culture too. Your children will have the opportunity to make lifelong friends from abroad and have an unforgettable summer they will be excited to share about!

WISCONSIN 4-H POLICY ... LET'S TAKE A CLOSER LOOK!

The Wisconsin 4-H Program is always evolving and we want to provide clear guidance to our leaders and members to ensure safety, security and support your efforts with our young people. In an effort to do this, I'd like to feature an article where we take a closer look at the Wisconsin 4-H Policies each month. Check out the updates, reminders, and information here monthly!

4-H Volunteers- Overview

Wisconsin 4-H Volunteers serve in a variety of educational and leadership roles that provide quality positive youth development programs such as:

- Supporting 4-H educational youth programs, activities, and experiences
- Leadership roles for club, county, or state-level groups
- Voting members of county/state-level groups
- Chaperones for 4-H educational experiences

4-H Volunteer Enrollment Process- All 4-H programs and activities must be supervised by a staff member or an approved 4-H volunteer, 18 years of age or older, who has completed all the following steps:

- Step 1: Enroll in 4-H Online including agreeing to the Division of Extension Volunteer Behavior Expectations.
- Step 2: Complete Criminal Background Check* (information will be sent via email to all new potential volunteers once a person has enrolled)
- Step 3: Complete Volunteer Training Modules:
 - Module 1: Complete UW Madison Title IX Training
 - Module 2: Complete UW System Mandated Reporter Training
 - Module 3: Complete Division of Extension Volunteers In Preparation (VIP) Training**
 - Module 4 (for chaperones only): Volunteers serving as a chaperone will need to also complete
 the <u>Supporting Youth Mental Health Training</u>

*A background records check for arrest and conviction records will be completed every four years for continuing 4-H volunteer leaders. **Returning volunteers who have been absent for one to four years need a background records check, signed Volunteer Behavior Expectations form, and Assumption of Risk but are not required to attend the orientation to be reinstated as a volunteer. Returning volunteers who have been absent for over four years need to repeat the entire Youth Protection process.

Chaperones- Wisconsin 4-H Chaperones must be approved 4-H volunteers 21 years of age or older that have completed the <u>Supporting Youth Mental Health Training</u>. Exceptions to the chaperone age requirement can be approved on a case-by-case basis by the 4-H Program Educator in consultation with a 4-H Regional Program Manager provided that the chaperone is at least 2 years older than the youth in the program or activity.

Supervision Ratios- All programs that are under the direction and control of 4-H staff or volunteers must meet or exceed the minimum standards for adult-to-minor supervision ratios as established by the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

Rule of Three

There must be at least two authorized adults and one minor, or one authorized adult and two minors, present for all programs unless the situation qualifies for or is approved for an exception.

- Some conversations may be most effective outside of the earshot of others (e.g., a child expressing concern for safety to a trusted adult). These conversations should take place in a location that is observable and/or interruptible, with other authorized adults aware of the interaction.
- In situations where an individual must take care of personal needs in a location that is not observable (e.g., a restroom), authorized adults must minimize the length of time that the rule of three is not maintained (e.g., check on the wellbeing of minors if absent an extended period of time).

Exceptions to the rule of three may be made in the following situations:

- Emergency situations (e.g., taking youth to the hospital) and other medical reasons (e.g., visit to a camp nurse).
- Ongoing training and mentoring programs where one-on-one interaction is justified by the educational value and permission has been granted through current university policy.
 - These interactions should take place in public places (e.g., coffee shop, library) whenever possible.
 - Educational materials highlighting the potential risks and benefits of unsupervised one-on-one interactions will be made available to parents/guardians.
- Situations in which a one-time exception is made through Extension's one-on-one exception procedure and agreed to in writing by the youth program participant's parent/guardian.

Transportation

Transportation to and from Extension activities is the responsibility of the participant and/or their parents/guardians. Individuals who choose to carpool to/from Extension programs assume any and all associated risks.

Driver Authorization for Volunteers

In situations where transportation for youth is provided as part of the Extension program, authorized adults who are 21 years of age or older and are approved to drive as part of their roles must complete the UW-Madison Driver Authorization.

- Extension volunteers must complete the <u>UW-Madison Driver Authorization process</u> and maintain approval status in order to drive personally owned or rented vehicles on University business when acting in their volunteer roles.
- When driving youth as part of an Extension role, individuals who are not the youth's parent/guardian must adhere to the rule of three unless approved through the Extension's one-on-one exception procedure and agreed to in writing by the youth program participant's parent/guardian in advance of the travel.
- Authorized adults who are transporting youth as part of their roles must follow Wisconsin Department of Transportation Child Safety Seat Laws. It is recommended that all unrelated youth program participants sit in the back seat, assuming the youth are all of similar ages.

Volunteers extend the resources of UW-Extension as they work with staff to deliver educational programs. Volunteering is a privilege. This training supports volunteers by providing an Overview of Extension; helping you to understand volunteer roles and responsibilities; sharing best practices when working with youth and helping you access resources available to you.

To volunteer, adults must complete all 4 steps: attend this training, have a background check done, complete a mandatory online reporting training, complete Title IX training, and enroll on 4HOnline.



4-H Thriving Model Program Quality Scores Sheboygan County 2022

The 4-H Thriving Model predicts that youth who participate in 4-H programs that provide a high-quality developmental context will thrive, and thriving youth achieve key developmental outcomes.

To determine scores for Program Quality, youth members age 13 and up were invited to take an online survey asking them questions about their 4-H experience. Sheboygan County results include responses from 56 youth. The survey was developed by Mary Arnold, Oregon State University and Ryan Gagnon, Clemson University. Wisconsin served as a pilot state for administering the survey in 2020 & 2021. The results shared in this brief were from surveys completed in 2022. After analyzing data, the scores are provided which assess each component of the model on a scale of 1-7, 7 meaning outstanding program quality.

Youth Sparks

The Youth Sparks outcome measures how 4-H programs give youth opportunities to explore topics they are interested in learning about, passionate about, engaged with.

Youth Belonging

This outcome measures how safe, welcome and supported youth feel in 4-H programs

Caring Adults

This outcome measures how youth feel the adults in their 4-H programs care about them and investing time in youth.

Challenging Growth

Challenging Growth outcome measures the extent to which adults in the program help youth to see new possibilities, push them to reach higher and hold them accountable.

Youth-Adult Partnerships

This outcome measures how youth feel about adult volunteers working with them and if they feel respected, listened to and have their ideas taken seriously.

Overall Score

Implications:

In Sheboygan County 4-H our young people are largely making great decisions and choosing to do the right thing. In fact, 91% of youth who responded to the survey agreed that they feel it is important for them to do the right thing and 90% indicate that they follow the rules when they are in a public setting, feel it is important for them to do their best and feel that if they keep working at something they will get better at it. This is one of the reasons that our program rated 5.6 out of 7 in the area of Youth Belonging. The Youth Belonging outcome of the survey measures how safe, welcome, and supported youth feel in 4-H programs.

The series of questions that measured the extent to which adults in the program help youth see new possibilities, push them to reach higher goals and hold them accountable provided an overall rating of 5.5 out of in Challenging Growth. This is an incredible opportunity for our program to strengthen. We want young people to thrive, and to do that they need to develop an intrinsic desire and willingness to try new challenges.
