**** NEW**** ROOM RESERVATIONS AT UWGB - SHEBOYGAN

We are implementing a new room reservation process on January 1, 2024. You are receiving this communication as a previous user of the rooms reserved through the UW Extension-Sheboygan County office.

Starting on January 1, 2024, users will be required to sign a Room Use and Expectations Request Form to reserve rooms. Room reservations will be confirmed once the signed form is received. The form is attached to this email for your reference.

How the new room reservation process will work:

- Contact the UW Extension-Sheboygan Office with your room reservation request.
- Receive an email with the attached Room Use and Expectations Request form.
- Read, sign, and date the form agreeing to the terms.
- Email, mail, or drop off your signed form.
- Once your signed form is received, your room will be officially reserved.
- You will receive a reservation confirmation email.

Users who don't follow the agreed-upon use expectations will not be given future room reservations. The new room reservation process is to guarantee rooms are available upon arrival for our guests and staff that use the UW Extension-Sheboygan office conference rooms.

CLUB DECISION-MAKING CORNER

This is a corner of the Crier to offer suggestions and tips in leading your club and project meetings. Sometimes I'll share Parliamentary Procedure Practices and other times I might give a little tip about engaging your members at your next meeting. I hope you enjoy these and please let me know how these suggestions work for you!

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There are many different kinds of **Motions** when using Parliamentary Procedure: Privileged Motions, Subsidiary Motions, Main Motions, and Incidental Motions. Let's start at the very beginning, well what most people would consider the beginning...

What is the Main Motion? A motion that brings business before the group and which can be made only while no other motion is pending. "I move we have a banquet." That's it! It's just a suggestion that the group does something and gets the ball rolling to discuss it. If no one makes a motion, then you don't have anything to discuss. Main motions can come from any member, officer, committee, or subcommittee.

WISCONSIN 4-H POLICY ... LET'S TAKE A CLOSER LOOK!

The Wisconsin 4-H Program is always evolving, and we want to provide clear guidance to our leaders and members to ensure safety and security and support your efforts with our young people. In an effort to do this, I'd like to feature an article where we take a closer look at the Wisconsin 4-H Policies each month. Check out the updates, reminders, and information here monthly!

Wisconsin 4-H staff and/or volunteers are **REQUIRED** to collect the UW-Madison Youth Event Health Form from all youth participants for all overnight 4-H programs and/or activities. It is **RECOMMENDED** that Wisconsin 4-H Staff and/or volunteers collect the UW-Madison Youth Event Health Form from all youth participants for all 4-H programs and/or activities that are three or more hours in duration and where 4-H staff or volunteers are in custodial care.*

* It is recommended that staff or volunteers in the custodial care of youth in programs less than 3 hours should have access to emergency contact information for youth participants. IMPORTANT:

- ALL overnight 4-H programs and activities must be reviewed and approved by the 4-H Program Educator.
- A Health Coordinator is required when collecting health forms.
- All health forms must be reviewed and possessed by a Health Coordinator during the 4-H program or activity.
- All health forms must be submitted to the Extension Office following the 4-H program or activity to comply with UW-Madison Records Retention policies.

Volunteer Health Coordinator

The Volunteer Health Coordinator role provides leadership for the health and safety needs of participants and works cooperatively with youth and adult volunteers in providing a safe event for youth. More information can be found on the Volunteer Health Coordinator Resources webpage.

Health Forms

- 4-H Youth Health Form 2023-2024 This form is REQUIRED for youth participating in overnight 4-H programs and/or activities. This is the same information that is collected through the Health Form in 4-H Online.
- Youth Event Health Form (Spanish)
- Youth Event Health Form Update/Changes All youth need to bring this form with them to the registration or bus-boarding site and give it to the chaperone. If there are no changes, please indicate where requested.
- Health Form Update/Changes (Spanish)
- Adult Health Form This form is RECOMMENDED for adult participants at overnight programs. It is required for overnight camping programs.

Other important information about Health Forms:

- The official UW-Madison Health Form has been reviewed and approved by UW-Madison Legal Counsel and the Office of Risk Management. No other health forms are to be used.
- Health forms for adults are recommended but not required. •
- Youth participants that are 18 years and older can sign their own Health Form.
- Authorized facsimile or scanned signatures are acceptable.

4-H VOLUNTEER TRAINING

I know that volunteering for the youth of Sheboygan County is not something you take lightly and is not something you do as a full-time job. Sometimes, the added responsibilities of training and paperwork can be perceived as a cumbersome obstacle to just "being there for kids," which is what we all want you to be able to do. <u>I do take</u> my role of helping you navigate your volunteers' roles and responsibilities in a palatable and even fun way through this <u>4-H program seriously. I believe that volunteering should be</u> both fun and rewarding for the youth and the adults in our program.

Here's what UW-Extension says: All 4-H programs and activities must be supervised by a staff member or an approved 4-H volunteer, 18 years of age or older, who has completed all the following steps:

Step 1: Enroll in 4-H Online including agreeing to the Division of Extension Volunteer Behavior Expectations.

4-H New Volunteer Orientation

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- Learn more about volunteering for UW-Madison Division of Extension
- Understand how to build safe spaces for youth & volunteers
- Discover the history and philosophies of 4-H
- Gain resources and tools that you can use in your volunteer role

Step 2: Complete Criminal Background Check* (information will be sent via email to all new potential volunteers once a person has enrolled)

- <u>Module 2: Complete UW System Mandated Reporter Training</u>
- Module 3: Complete Division of Extension Volunteers In Preparation (VIP) Training**

 Module 4 (for chaperones only): Volunteers serving as a chaperone will need also to complete the Supporting Youth Mental Health Training *A background records check for arrest and conviction records will be completed every four years for continuing 4-H volunteer leaders.

Returning volunteers who have been absent for one to four years need a background record to check, a **signed Volunteer Behavior Expectations form, and an Assumption of Risk but are not required to attend the orientation to be reinstated as a volunteer. Returning volunteers who have been absent for over four years need to repeat the entire Youth Protection process.

WHAT IS EXPECTED OF 4-H PROJECT LEADERS?

- Get started now! Member enthusiasm for a project is highest at the time of enrollment. Find out who is enrolled in the project and set up your meetings.
- Help members keep a record of what they did or made in the project during the year.
- Review progress toward the year's goals at your final meeting of the year.
- Organize and conduct at least three to six project meetings per year. Remember project tours and individual sessions can be offered to members in addition to group meetings.
- Involve youth leaders in meaningful ways. They are capable of helping in planning and teaching--not just being the helper or the clean up crew!
- Set an example in being prepared, organized, and flexible in working with youth.

COOKING WITH MEAT PROJECT BOX

Do you want to learn more about cooking with meat from one of the following market animal projects: beef, swine, sheep, goat, poultry, or rabbit?

Calumet County 4-H and the Distance Learning Team brings you the opportunity to participate in the Cooking with Meat Project Box. By participating in this distance learning project, youth will learn the following:

- The safe way to cook, store, freeze and thaw meat of the different project species.
- How to find the correct internal temperature of meat cuts.

CAT PROJECT "MEWS"

It's that special time of the year when we gather with friends and family to celebrate all the wonderful holidays (and food) this season brings. As joyous as this time is, we all know how stressful it can be as well. This is especially true for our pets. Since the project will not be gathering until after the New Year, here are some tips to help keep everyone safe and happy:

- Seasonal Plants: Amaryllis, Cyclamen, Ivy, Mistletoe, Holly, Lilies, Christmas trees and tree water - Ingestion can cause nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, cardiovascular problems, kidney failure and even death.
- Decorations: Tinsel, Garland and Ribbon Playing leads to chewing which • can lead to swallowing causing blockages and other damage to the esophagus and digestive tract including emergency surgery.
- Holiday Food: Chocolate, dairy, sweets, fatty or salty food like turkey skin, gravy or ham trimmings, yeast • dough, onion and bones (especially cooked). Besides the risks of choking, symptoms include vomiting, diarrhea, excessive urination and dehydration, seizures, pancreatitis, anemia, coma and death.
- Stranger Danger Even the most social of pets can get overwhelmed with all the noise and commotion of the festivities. Make sure they have a safe, comfortable space to retreat to with their necessities (i.e. litterbox, food & water, bed etc.) Keeping a close eye on the door whenever guests come and go will help prevent unwanted escapes.

The next project meeting will be January 22 at 6:30 pm at UW Extension. We will hand out and briefly discuss the project's handbook as well as basic anatomy, nutrition and a nail trimming demo.

Last but not least, even though the new 4-H year has started, it's never too late to join so make sure you spread the word. Remember, you can earn \$100 in Kitty Kash when you recruit a friend to the project.

WISCONSIN 4-H FOUNDATION KICKS OFF WISCONSIN 4-H ART CONTEST



The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will sponsor the art contest, open to any current Wisconsin 4-H member, with cash prizes totaling nearly \$1,000. The contest will be held virtually, with photos of all entries submitted electronically.

The contest is broken into nine categories:

- 1. Drawing Using Any Medium
- 2. Painting (acrylic, watercolor or oil)
- 3. Pottery, Ceramics or Clay
- 4. Photography
- 5. Paper
- 6. Fabric, Yarn or Fiber
- 7. Any Other Media (ex: digital, metalcraft, jewelry, leatherwork, wax, eggshells, taxidermy, etc.)
- 8. 4-H Art Non-Photography
- 9. 4-H Art Photography

A winner will be chosen in each category with a Best of Show award given to one entry chosen by the judging committee. Category winners will receive a \$100 cash award. The Best of Show entry will receive an additional \$150 cash award. Other art may be recognized but will not receive a cash award. Winners will be notified by email in March. A complete winner's list, as well as photos of the winning entries, will be on the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Website by late March.

To be eligible for the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Art Contest, youth must be a 4-H member enrolled in 4-H Online for the 2023-2024 4-H Program Year. Entrants do not need to be enrolled in any specific project to participate.

4-H Club Meetings

Almost every 4-H club holds **regular** club meetings. Even within the same club, no two club meetings are the same. Ideally, every meeting should have three parts—**recreation** (fun), business, and learning. Youth leadership plays a huge role in the success of a club.

Most clubs have youth officers (president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and other selected roles) who are responsible for running each meeting. Youth leaders not only gain excellent life skills, they help to keep the meeting relevant and fun for members of all ages. All youth have a responsibility to contribute to their clubs through their voice and their actions!

What is my role as an adult?

Adults help create a safe, positive atmosphere for all 4-H members when they empower and encourage youth. While at a meeting, it's important to be a positive role model for everyone in attendance. Caring adults play an important role in the mental health of youth, and 4-H can help connect youth with positive adults.



Adult Edition

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Make this a positive experience.

- 1. Actively listen to all 4-H members.
- 2. Let youth run the meeting. It's their club!
- 3. Attend as many meetings as possible.
- 4. Ask your club leader how you can help.
- 5. If you have a hobby or skill, consider offering to be a guest speaker!

Should I stay or should I go?

It's strongly recommended that parents/guardians attend the 4-H meeting with your child. Club meetings provide great opportunities to learn with other club members, but the learning doesn't stop there. By attending the meeting, you can reflect on the meeting together and continue the education outside the club.

How is the meeting run?

Most 4-H clubs use **parliamentary procedure** to make club decisions. See if you can put the five steps of this procedure in order. Each step is written in **bold**. The answers are found at the bottom of the adult edition.

Re-state the Motion—The president restates the motion before the group votes.

Discussion—The motion is discussed by all members. Members might want to bring up good or bad things about the motion, or maybe find some ways that it needs to be changed.

Motion—A motion is a request that something can be done. Only one motion should be placed before the group at one time. A motion can be discussed and changed.

Vote—The group votes to decide if they will pass or deny the motion. Voting usually happens by voice. Members say "aye" if they agree, and "nay" if they disagree. Voting sometimes happens in other ways (secret ballot, show of hands).

Second—If someone agrees with the motion, they can "second the motion," which means it can be discussed by all members.
