- What does your child expect to do at camp? Learning about the camp experience beforehand allows you to create positive expectations.
- Are you able to share consistent and positive messages about camp? Your confidence in a positive experience will be contagious.

In addition, each site may offer a variety of workshops like poster and photography contests or horse judging activities.

- 2. These events are focused on the learning experience rather than the contest.
- 3. Area Animal Science Days contests are open to currently enrolled 4-H members
- 4. Activities and offerings may vary at each area site depending on the host county facilities and resources
- 5. Age Divisions: There are age divisions for this contest. Please see the current year registration guide for most up-to-date rules.

CLUB RESOURCES CORNER

This is a corner of the Crier to offer suggestions and tips for leading your club and project meetings. Sometimes, I'll share Parliamentary Procedure Practices; other times; I might give a little tip about engaging your members at your next meeting. I hope you enjoy these suggestions. Please let me know how they work for you!

Blanket Identification Game: You will need a blanket you cannot see through for this game. Two people hold up the blanket as if it were a curtain. Separate the rest of the players into two groups and place them on opposite sides of the blanket. Each team selects one player (very quietly so the other team doesn't hear), who then stands next to the blanket. Make sure the two opposing players cannot see each other. Each team selects a player who will shout out the opposing player's name, standing at the blanket when the blanket is dropped. The one who shouts the name correctly first gets a point. The first team with 10 points wins. Hint: Do not tell them the game or the rules until the blanket is up and the teams are separated.

4-H Projects and Activities Policies Hayride Tip Sheet (New Tip Sheet)

Hayrides are a common 4-H activity that can be an enjoyable and memorable experience for youth. 4-H Clubs and Groups are encouraged to use an agriculture tourism business to participate in hayrides. If an organization/facility is not available or if the cost will restrict participation, 4-H Clubs and Groups may organize a hayride on a private farm/property if the <u>Wisconsin 4-H Hayride Tip Sheet</u> is followed.

Roadside Clean-up Policy (New Policy)

Regardless of the road (including state highways, county highways, streets, etc.) 4-H Clubs and Groups must follow the <u>Wisconsin Department of Transportation</u> rules/guidelines, youth volunteers must be at least 11 years of age or in the 6th grade, to participate in roadside clean-ups.

UPHAM WOODS PERSONAL FLOTATION DEVICE (PFD) FUND

Personal Flotation Devices (PFDs), sometimes called "life jackets," are critical to waterfront activities at Upham Woods. Last year, over 4,600 youth used Upham Woods PFDs! With an average lifespan of 10 years, these PFDs kept over **46,000 kids** safe on the water.

Canoeing, kayaking, and the many waterfront activities at Upham Woods are favorites of Sheboygan County Campers. The following sizes and quantities of Onyx life jackets are needed.

> Child (33-55 lbs.): 30 at \$17.50 each Youth (55-88 lbs.): 60 at \$17.50 each Adult (90+ lbs.): 50 at \$17.50 each The entire purchase of 140 PFDs will cost \$2,450. So far, we have raised \$1,985.00 – Just \$465 away from our goal!!!


