

SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS

LEADERS ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP - DUE MARCH 1, 2025

One \$1000 scholarship will be awarded by the Sheboygan County 4-H Leaders Association, Inc. Four additional scholarships are available at \$500 each. Additional scholarships may be awarded based on funds available.

Eligibility:

- a. Applicants majoring in any professional technical, vocational, college or other training equivalent of at least one school year in length.
- b. All high school seniors or post high school students currently in their first, second, or third year of higher education are eligible to apply.
- c. 4-H members are eligible to receive only one scholarship from the Sheboygan County 4-H Leaders Association. You may reapply if you didn't receive a scholarship.

Minimum Requirements:

- a. Five years as an achieving 4-H club member, with at least two years and current achievement in the Sheboygan County 4-H Program.
- b. Must be a current achieving 4-H member, or 4-H graduate.
- c. A letter of recommendation from a 4-H Leader (leader should comment on member's quality of project work, community service and club leadership)

Parents, guardians and Extension Educators recommendations are <u>not</u> eligible and will not be forwarded to the committee for review.

ART BEAT 2025

Art Beat is for any 4-H member in grades 3-5 and will be held at U**pham woods March 15-16, 2025**. You can register through 4-H Online. Applications will be open January 20 - February 17 or until the camp fills.

WHAT IS IT? - Art Beat is a 4-H, hands on, interactive art experience in beautiful Upham Woods in the Wisconsin Dells. Participants will learn to juggle, make visual arts, create a STEAM project, explore music, and much, much more. Art Beat is led by older 4-H youth and professional artists in a variety of disciplines from painting, theater, textiles, and music. 4-Hers will also get to experience an overnight camp adventure. The goal for Art Beat is to help young people to explore their artistic sparks.


WHEN IS IT? - Art Beat begins at 9:00 Saturday morning, March 15th and will wrap up after lunch on Sunday, March 16th. This year we are also offering overnight lodging on Friday evening, for an additional cost, to help with those that may have too far to travel Saturday morning. Along with art activities, 4-Hers will also participate in traditional camp activities like campfire, spirit contest, and counselor-led fun.

COST? - Based on the success of Arts Camp pricing, we will again offer a tiered price structure. Our goal is to make Art Beat more accessible to more youth. Whether you choose the highest or lowest tier, you will get the same great 4-H programming. \$100, \$125, \$145 are the three tiers. \$125 is closest to the actual cost of the program. We are also asking volunteers who spend the night to pay \$75, which covers food and lodging to help control costs for all youth participants. Please contact your local 4-H educator about scholarship opportunities at the county or Leader's Association level. State Scholarship opportunities are also available. Some local 4-H clubs may even help with the cost.

ADULT CHAPERONES - If you are interested in volunteering to be a chaperone for Art Beat, we are currently looking for trained volunteers to join the fun. You will help to provide leadership in the cabins and rotate through each of the art tracks. MAKER SPACE - Along with learning about art, there is an opportunity for 4-H members to teach fellow 4-Her's through our Maker Space. The Science of the Chocolate Chip Cookie

What's your ultimate favorite chocolate chip cookie? Do you prefer your cookie to be soft or are you a crispy cookie person? Do you prefer thick or thin cookies? Everyone likes what they like. In this program, you get to find or create your own perfect recipe that turns out every single time you make it.

Some of the things we will cover in this curriculum are as follows:

- Softened butter vs melted butter
- Chilled dough vs baking right away
- Changing the baking temp
- Best practices for measuring flour
- Measuring vs weighing ingredients

There are so many variables or science to making the perfect chocolate chip cookie. By the time you're done going through all these lessons, you should have your perfect recipe!

Project Supplies: We are not providing supplies for this project. Here is the **supply list** so you can plan ahead.

Kitchen Scale: We encourage the use of a kitchen scale that shows ounces. If you have one to use or can purchase one, please do so. We understand that buying a kitchen scale might not be possible for everyone. To ensure everyone can join, we have a limited number of free scales for those who need them. If you need a free digital kitchen scale sent to you, please let us know in the registration form.

Connection: This is a self-guided course with connection activities that use Padlet. As we get closer to the start date for this program, we will send registered participants a link.

Please plan to participate in the **virtual session on February 27 at 6:00m, on Zoom** covering the best way to measure ingredients and why oven temperatures matter.
